State Health Assessment and Improvement Plan





How we're doing it

- Steering committee advises and sets overall priorities
- OHA implements, gathers information, and performs assessments.
- OHA writes final deliverables
- Steering Committee recommends them to OHA as final

Our timeline and deliverables

1. April 2024-August 2024: Building the foundation

Convene the steering committee

Gather reflections and lessons from the previous SHA/ SHIP cycle

Develop mission, vision and values to guide the process



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Use the mission, vision and values to develop priorities for the three assessments. Will use new and existing data to reflect trends and avoid repeated surveys.



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3. March 2025- May 2025: Developing the state health improvement plan

The Steering Committee will review the SHA to choose at least two priorities with strategies and metrics.

These will become the state health improvement plan.

What is the State Health Improvement Plan (SHIP)?

Vision:

Oregon will be a place where health and wellbeing are achieved across the lifespan for people of all races, ethnicities, disabilities, genders, sexual orientations, socioeconomic status, nationalities and geographic locations.

Who is the SHIP for

Everyone in Oregon

HTO focused on the following OR residents:

- Black, Indigenous, People of Color, and American Indian/ Alaska Native
- People with low incomes
- People who identify as LGBTQIA+
- People with disabilities
- People living in rural areas

Our center: health equity

Oregon will have established a health system that creates health equity when all people can reach their full health potential and well-being and are not disadvantaged by their race, ethnicity, language, disability, age, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, social class, intersections among these communities or identities, or other socially determined circumstances.

Achieving health equity requires the ongoing collaboration of all regions and sectors of the state, including tribal governments to address:

- The equitable distribution or redistribution of resources and power; and
- Recognizing, reconciling and rectifying historical and contemporary injustices.
