

# **Drinking Water Source Protection Award Program**

The Oregon Health Authority and Oregon Department of Environmental Quality are now awarding certificates of recognition to public water systems that reduce risks to their sources of drinking water. This is one way our agencies can acknowledge excellence in drinking water source protection efforts, protecting a critical resource for people in Oregon. Award certificates can promote consumer trust, positive customer relations, and public support in protecting drinking water sources.

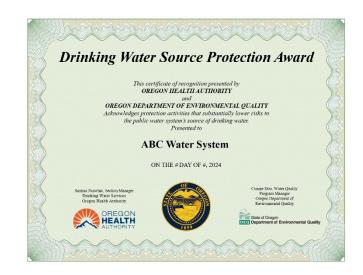
Drinking water protection in the state of Oregon is voluntary. Public water systems can protect their sources of drinking water with strategies that address risks present within a source area as identified in their <u>source water assessment reports</u> (https://www.oregon.gov/deq/wq/dwp/Pages/DWPAssessments.aspx). Reducing contamination risks that have the highest likelihood of affecting water quality can lower treatment costs for public water systems.

## How to apply for an award
