## **Objective**

To provide commercial health benefit plan partners a monthly standardized update about the latest developments in Family Connects Oregon.

## **Status Update**

• The 2025-2027 Reimbursement Advisory Committee (RAC)'s first meeting was on November 21. The first meeting's agenda gave members the Statutory Framework, Overview of the Rate Setting Process, Role of the RAC and the Cost Template and Cost Template Standards presentation. RAC members have until Friday, December 6 to give their comments and suggestions on the Cost Template and Cost Template Standards.

## RAC Next Steps

- OHA will meet in early December to review and integrate RAC member comments into the Cost Template and Cost Template Standards. The final Cost Template and Cost Template Standards will go out to FCO sites by Monday, December 16, 2024. Cost Templates will be due to OHA by February 14, 2025.
- FCO Rules Advisory Committee update We are in the final stages of amending the FCO program rules, OAR chapter 333 division 6. FCO has a legislative mandate to meet the needs of communities where the program operates. There is a need to expand the type of organizations eligible to be designated as the Newborn Nurse Home Visiting Provider and Community Lead to include, for example, hospitals and non-profit organizations. To better support equitable implementation and decrease administrative burden, various other minor changes are being made.

The proposed rules change will go into effect on January 1, 2025.

### FCO site launch updates:

- Lane County Public Health began offering services on November 1, 2024.
- Yamhill County Public Health will begin offering services starting January 1, 2025.
- o Polk County Health Department will launch services in February 2025.

- United Community Action Network (UCAN; Douglas County) will begin offering services
   February 1, 2025.
- o South Coast is planning to offer services starting July 1, 2025.
- Multnomah County is planning to offer services starting late 2025.
- Our first carrier call of 2025 will be Tuesday, January 21, 2025 at 1:05 p.m. via Microsoft
