- The 2025-2027 Reimbursement Advisory Committee's first meeting is on Thursday,
 November 21. The first meeting's agenda will an overview of the Statutory Framework, Overview
 of the Rate Setting Process, Role of the RAC and the Cost Template and Budget Standards
 presentation.
- FCO Rules Advisory Committee update We are in the process of amending the FCO program rules, OAR chapter 333 division 6. To "meet the needs of communities where the program operates," per legislative mandate, there is a need to expand the type of organizations eligible to be designated as the Newborn Nurse Home Visiting Provider and Community Lead to include, for example, hospitals and non-profit organizations. To better support equitable implementation and decrease administrative burden, various other minor changes are being made.

You are invited to review and comment on the proposed rules. There are two (2) options to provide comment:

- You may provide oral (spoken) testimony during a public hearing scheduled on Tuesday,
 November 19, 2024, at 11:00 A.M. Pacific Time via video/phone conference using
 Microsoft Teams
- Written comments may be submitted before 5:00 P.M. Pacific Time on November 22, 2024
