Opill Available at 340B Price

Opill, the newly-approved over-the-counter daily contraceptive pill, is now available at a discounted 340B price to 340B covered entities. This is a new development, so it is possible that some wholesalers and distributors do not yet have a contract with Perrigo, the manufacturer. The Apexus Prime Vendor Program does not yet have a contract with Perrigo.

If your current seller of 340B drugs doesn't have Opill available, you can reach out to Perrigo Direct[¬].

Eliminate Disparities to Advance Health Equity and Increase Collaboration and Coordination Across Systems

The Office of Population Affair's (OPA) Week 4 of National Adolescent Health Month focused on eliminating health disparities. Adolescents have multiple and diverse needs and require different supports to be healthy. By reducing the burden of disease, injury, and violence, we allow adolescents to reach their fullest potential. We can promote health and well-being for all adolescents by addressing social drivers and meeting their diverse needs. It is also critical to increase coordination and collaboration within and across the systems serving young people. These systems can include pediatric settings, social service programs, and the child welfare system. Collaboration and coordination across settings and systems can maximize resources, reduce duplication of efforts, and promote quality and transparency. This could mean putting services in one location, streamlining application and referral systems, or sharing data and communicating across programs.
