Formula updates

- Enfacare NeuroPro- can size change from 12.8 oz to 13.6 oz, April 2021
- KetoCal 3:1- slight formulation change in vitamin/minerals and increase in kcal, April 2021
- New Nutricia formula available in the US- Fortini. It is a ready to feed, 30 kcal/oz formula for term infants with increase energy requirements and/or fluid restrictions. We will monitor requests for this formula.

Innovations: Diabetes Prevention Program & WIC

 Oregon WIC is partnering with Comagine, CDC grantee for providing National Diabetes Prevention Program (NDPP) to rural and underserved areas.

• Methods:

- Survey WIC RDS
- Offer 3 WIC RDs the DPP lifestyle coaching training
- Conduct focus groups with WIC participants
- Sponsor 50 slots for WIC participants to join online DPP course
- Engage WIC RDs trained in DPP to provide recommendations to CDC
