Reasons for Formula Issuance

- Preference
- Intolerance
- Food allergy

Soy is a Preference

- Soy-based formulas are indicated for:
 - Family food preference to exclude cow's milk from the diet
 - Vegetarian diets
- Soy-based formulas are NOT indicated for:




- Premature infants
- Cow's milk protein allergy

Soy Formula & Preterm Infants

- American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) does not recommend soy-based formulas for infants born < 1800 grams (4 lbs) for the following reasons:
 - Preterm infants on soy-based formula demonstrated significantly less weight gain, less linear growth and lower serum albumin levels
 - Risk of osteopenia

Food Intolerance

- Lactose intolerance is a food intolerance, not a food allergy
- Formula that addresses lactose intolerance:

Allergies: Skin


- Hives, eczema-- outward signs of food allergies

Urticaria (hives)




Allergies: Gastrointestinal

- Stool irregularities
- Gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD)
- Eosinophilic esophagitis
- Enteropathy/severe colitis
- Celiac disease
- Food protein-induced enterocolitis syndrome (FPIES)
- Food protein-induced proctocolitis (FPIP)


Allergies: Respiratory




- Bronchospasm
- Asthma
- Heiner's syndrome
(very rare, pulmonary bleeding after ingesting milk)

Allergens in infant formula


Most

All standard infant formulas (cow-based and soy-based) are made of intact protein chains that can trigger allergic reactions



Hydrolysate formulas break the protein chain into pieces, peptides. Helps with tolerance, may still trigger an allergic reaction



Amino acid-based formulas are made from individual non-allergenic amino acids








