

## ***Oregon Public Meetings Law - Complaint Form***

### **Violations of Oregon Public Meetings Law**

There are mandatory prerequisites for submitting Public Meetings Law complaints to the Oregon Government Ethics Commission (OGEC). These prerequisites also apply to executive session complaints. **If you fail to satisfy the mandatory prerequisites before filing your complaint with OGEC, the OGEC has stated that it will dismiss your complaint.**

If you feel comfortable addressing your public meetings law concern directly with the Health Licensing Office (HLO), we encourage you to do so. However, if this is not possible or if your concerns remain unresolved, the Oregon Government Ethics Commission (OGEC) has the authority to enforce public meetings laws.
