OHA reviewed the triage team and data collection feedback shared by committee members during the March committee meeting. The information below reflects additional questions, concerns and ideas committee members shared throughout the May meeting.

Questions

- How do you implement the triage team recommendations when staffing is a possible scarce resource during an emergency?
- What would the consequences be for providers not complying?
- In committee member's experience, have there been policies where people thought it was impossible but it is now being implemented?
- How do we define feasibility? What does it mean if something is unfeasible? Are we talking about costs, dollars, people to execute? Why are those the benchmark?
- Will there be enough people to follow all of the things we are trying to do?
- Who will lead the training so that there is consistency?
- Is ongoing training realistic for a process that might be implemented every ten years?
- Have we discussed HIPAA and community member involvement on the triage team?
