1964 Earthquake and Tsunami – The 9.2 magnitude earthquake that struck the Prince William Sound region of Alaska on March 27th, generated a tsunami across the Pacific basin that effected affected Cannon Beach and Seaside. The tsunami caused over \$230,000 in damage to Cannon Beach. In Seaside, ocean water surged up the Necanicum River channels, carrying debris, sand, and logs. Five people died in Oregon - four were children at Beverly Beach State Park. It was the largest recorded earthquake in North America and the second largest in the world.
