Oregon Psilocybin Services (OPS) rules require psilocybin training programs with approved curriculum to acquire and maintain licenses with the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) or receive a determination from HECC that a license is not required. The rules also require psilocybin training programs to demonstrate proof of compliance with HECC license requirements within a specific timeframe.

Psilocybin training programs that received OPS curriculum approval prior to December 31, 2023, must provide documentation that they have applied for or received a license from HECC, or requested or received a determination from HECC that a license is not required no later than June 1, 2024. **This is 60 days from today's date.**

If your program has applied for a HECC license or requested a determination that a license is not required, please provide the required documentation to OPS by completing the  [HECC Verification Form](#) and following the instructions contained in the form.

If your program has already received a HECC license or received a determination that a license is not required, please provide OPS with proof of licensure or determination that a license is not required by uploading documentation and sending to the OPS Licensing Program using the Training License and Compliance (TLC) system.

Failure to provide the required documentation under the timelines described above may result in revocation of OPS curriculum approval. OPS may also revoke curriculum approval if HECC denies a psilocybin training program's license application. Finally, after a psilocybin training program has received a license or a determination from HECC that approval is not required, the psilocybin training program must maintain that status to ensure that their OPS curriculum approval is not affected.
