1) Welcome & Introduction – Jen Chandler, OHA	1:00 – 1:05 (5 minutes)
2) 2025-27 TPEP Budget Overview – Jen Chandler, OHA	1:05 – 1:30 (25 minutes)
Objective: Update TRAC members on current 2025-2027 Measure 44 and Ballot Measure 108 revenue projections.	
Background: Biennial TPEP budget is based on tobacco tax revenue as identified by M44 and BM108. HPCDP tracks projected revenue estimates through quarterly Oregon Office of Economic Analysis forecast reports to support program planning.	
Discussion:	



- Cigarette pack sales are decreasing and data shows a decrease in cigarette consumption which also reflects a decrease in tobacco sales revenue.
- 2025-2027 estimated tobacco tax revenue will not likely include any carryover funding.
- Budget estimates are updated quarterly and updates will be shared regularly with partners

<u>Objective:</u> To update TRAC members on the status of Requests for Application (RFA) for HPCDP grantee programs.

Background:

HPCDP programs are funded on a biennial period. The current 2023-2025 biennium will end on June 30th, 2025 and the 2025-2027 biennium will begin on July 1, 2025 and end on June 30, 2027. All programs funded by HPCDP are required to submit a proposed workplan and budget for each biennium that is then reviewed, revised (as needed), and approved by HPCDP staff.

ADPEP & TPEP: Alcohol and other Drug Prevention Education Program (ADPEP) and Tobacco Prevention Education Program (TPEP) programs are on a similar timeline for the RFA process. HPCDP Staff started working on the new RFAs in August. From September to November, both programs are convening workgroups with coordinators to receive feedback and ideas from coordinators, discuss potential changes, and review the RFA's first draft. Final revisions will then be made in December. Anticipated timeline of release in slide deck.

Discussion:

- TPEP/ADPEP Currently convening TPEP and ADPEP Coordinator workgroups to inform RFA. See timeline slide.
- Regional Health Equity Coalitions (RHEC) convening engagement meetings with RHECs to improve and inform funding guidance. Application will be released in mid-March. Changes: introducing a quarterly meeting with RHECs and HPCDP staff, transition to invoicing model to upfront payment model (75%)



- upon contract, 25% once grant deliverables are complete), rewriting contracts in upcoming biennium to correct previous outdated contracts.
- Public Health Equity (PHE) Grants current funding was scheduled to end in June 2025, but has been extended to December 2025. Currently reviewing work plans and budgets for new biennium. RFGA will be released July – September 2025.

4) CDC Menthol: Opportunity Evaluation User Group – Helen Kidane, OHA

<u>Objective:</u> To invite you to take part in the menthol and flavors evaluation on the core user group panel.

<u>Background:</u> We are looking for TRAC members to join an important effort aimed at reducing tobacco use and menthol tobacco-related disparities in communities across our state. In collaboration with RMC Research and with support from CDC funding, OHA is working to develop a comprehensive, five-year evaluation plan that addresses the disproportionate impact of menthol and flavored tobacco products on Black and African American, rural and frontier community members, and youth within these communities across Oregon.

As part of this project, we are forming a Core User Group that will bring together diverse partners with a shared commitment to tobacco control and health equity. Your knowledge and lived experience would be invaluable as we work to ensure that culturally appropriate cessation resources are not only developed but also embedded within community-based programs and supported through effective evaluation.

Discussion:

- As a member of this group, you will have the opportunity to collaborate on the development of the 5-year evaluation plan and help guide respectful and inclusive conversations around reducing health inequities through a CDC grant addressing menthol use.

5) TPEP Ambassador Updates – Ayla Ervin, OHA Objective: Provide update on TPEP Ambassadors, shared governance timeline and next steps.	2:15 – 2:30 (15 minutes)
Background: The Oregon TPEP has historically had two bodies that provide external perspectives on how tobacco tax revenues should be allocated for tobacco prevention and cessation. A TPEP Ambassador Group comprised of community-based organizations, Regional Health Equity Coalitions, national advocates and Local Public Health Authorities is convening to provide recommendations for a single governance group that reflects all partners in the commercial tobacco prevention system.	

Discussion:

- Request to rescind Executive Order that established TRAC has been submitted to Governor's office.
- TPEP Ambassadors provided recommended scope of work and composition.
- Question (Irina Turceanu): Will the shared governance group start next year?
 - Yes, aiming to begin recruitment this Fall/early Winter 2024 to start working together in the beginning of 2025.
- Question (Christina Bodamer): How many LPHAs, RHECs and CBOs are funded?
 - 35 county programs, 8 RHECs, 91 CBOs
 - For group composition, we wanted to create balance between funded and unfunded partners. There is some level of parity of funding that partners receive across categories.
