Oregon Health Authority Emergency Medical Services Program: Emergency Medical Services Advisory Board (EMSAB) Members

This document provides a description of and qualifications for the 19 EMSAB members appointed by the Director of the Oregon Health Authority. Contact the Emergency Medical Services Program if you have any questions, ems.trauma@odhsoha.oregon.gov.

- 1. The **State EMS Medical Director of the Emergency Medical Services Program** is an ex officio member and serves as the chairperson.
- 2. One *patient advocate or an education professional* who specializes in health equity.
 - Oregon education professional who teaches health equity as part of their curriculum or program <u>or</u> an Oregon patient advocate who provides patients and caregiver support and education for decision-making.
- 3. One must be an *emergency medical services (EMS) provider* licensed under <u>ORS 682.216</u> who represents a *private emergency medical services agency* licensed under <u>ORS 682.047</u>.
 - Oregon licensed EMS provider who works for a privately-owned Oregon licensed EMS agency.
- 4. One *emergency medical services provider licensed* under <u>ORS 682.216</u> who represents a public emergency medical services agency licensed under <u>ORS 682.047</u>.
 - Oregon licensed EMS provider who works for a public Oregon licensed EMS agency.
- 5. One representative of a *non-transport emergency medical services agency*.
 - Representative of an Oregon EMS or fire agency that does not transport patients.
- 6. One representative of a *labor union that represents emergency medical service providers*.
 - Oregon labor union employee or person appointed by a labor union, which may include a licensed EMS provider who is a labor union member.
- 7. One *emergency medical services provider* licensed under <u>ORS 682.216</u> who works for an *emergency medical services agency* licensed under <u>ORS 682.047</u> within a *rural emergency medical services system or a rural hospital* as defined in <u>ORS 442.470</u>.
 - Oregon rural EMS agency or rural hospital EMS provider, as defined by the <u>Oregon Office</u> of Rural Health.
- 8. One representative of *county ambulance service area administrators*.
 - Oregon county administrator who manages the Ambulance Service Area Plan.
- 9. One representative of *special districts that operate ambulances*.
 - Oregon local government-based ambulance service identified as a special district.

- 10. One hospital administrator in a hospital that operates an emergency department.
 - Oregon hospital executive that oversees a hospital emergency department.
- 11. One *nurse who works in a hospital emergency department*, as defined in <u>ORS 678.010 to</u> 678.410.
 - Oregon licensed nurse who works in a hospital emergency department.
- 12. One representative of a *public safety answering point*, as defined in ORS 403.105.
 - Oregon-based 9-1-1 dispatch center representative.
- 13. One *emergency medicine physician*, as defined in ORS chapter 677.
 - Oregon licensed physician who specializes in emergency medicine.
- 14. One *person who works in a long term care facility*, as defined in <u>ORS 442.015</u>, or *who represents long term care facilities, or who works in a residential facility*, as defined in <u>ORS 443.400</u>, or who *represents residential facilities*.
 - Employee of an Oregon long-term care or residential facility.
- 15. One public member who is, or has been, a frequent user of emergency medical services.
 - Oregon resident who has no monitory gain for seeking board membership, and who has as a patient or as a caregiver, frequently used or currently uses emergency medical services.
- 16. One representative of a *third-party payer of health care insurance*.
 - Employee of a health care insurance organization, public or private, that pays or insures medical expenses on behalf of Oregon subscribers.
- 17. One representative of a *patient health care advocacy group*.
 - Employee of or an active volunteer that is approved to represent an Oregon patient advocacy group that increases public awareness of a disease and its symptoms, risk factors, preventive measures, and treatment options.
- 18. One representative of a *rural hospital*, *or a hospital system that includes a rural hospital*, as defined in ORS 442.470.
 - Employee of an Oregon rural hospital or hospital system that includes a rural hospital, as defined by the <u>Oregon Office of Rural Health</u>.
- 19. One emergency medical services physician.
 - Oregon licensed physician who serves as the supervising physician of an EMS agency or agencies, as defined by <u>OAR 847-035-0025</u>.
