## Oregon Health Authority Emergency Medical Services Program: Emergency Medical Services for Children Advisory Committee (EMSCAC) Members

This document provides a description of and qualifications for the 10 EMSCAC members named in the 2024 EMS Modernization Bill (<u>HB 4081 - 2024</u>), as well as the members named in the EMSCAC Bylaws. All members are appointed by the Director of the Oregon Health Authority. - 1. Two *physicians specializing in the treatment of pediatric emergency patients*, as defined in ORS chapter 677.
  - Oregon licensed physicians who specialize in pediatric emergency medicine and work in an Oregon hospital emergency department or for an Oregon emergency medical services agency.
- 2. One *nurse who has pediatric emergency experience*, as defined in ORS 678.010 to 678.410.
  - Oregon licensed nurse who has pediatric emergency medicine experience and is currently working in an Oregon hospital emergency department.
- 3. One *physician with pediatric training*, as defined in ORS chapter 677.
  - Oregon licensed physician with pediatric training (e.g., pediatrician, pediatric surgeon).
- 4. One *emergency medical services (EMS) provider* licensed under ORS 682.216.
  - Oregon licensed EMS provider who works for an Oregon licensed EMS agency.
- 5. One representative of the Emergency Medical Services Program.
  - Oregon Health Authority Emergency Medical Services Program representative responsible for development and implementation of the state EMS system, including but not limited to EMS provider training standards and scope of practice.
- 6. One project director of a statewide committee related to emergency medical services for children.
  - Oregon Emergency Medical Services Program Director responsible for providing the EMSCAC with leadership and support to achieve federal grant performance measures.
- 7. One program manager of a statewide committee related to emergency medical services for children.
  - Oregon Emergency Medical Services for Children Program Manager responsible for managing program initiatives, finances, performance measure outcomes, and EMSCAC membership.

## 8. One *family representative*.

- Oregon community leader who promotes the needs of children and families, while considering all aspects of the emergency medical services system. Special consideration given to Title V Maternal & Child Health - Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs grantee.
- 9. One *representative of a patient equity organization* or an *academic professional* specializing in health equity.
  - Oregon patient equity organization employee or active volunteer <u>or</u> Oregon education professional who researches health equity or teaches health equity as part of their curriculum or program.
