## **Overall Progress Narrative:**

In Q1 2024, programs have continued to make progress with a particular focus on preparations for HARP launch. Major milestones include:

- Launch of the HARP Eligibility Questionnaire, which has received close to 750 responses to date.
- Launch of a renter questionnaire to inform future program design for HOP.
- Determined county allocations for HOP after meetings with local elected officials to discuss the design and structure of the program.
  - Prepared our 7 local Intake partners to begin intake, including developing signage and badging.
  - Completed 17 trainings for internal staff and local subrecipient partners.
- Launched the ReOregon Call Center, which has logged more than 1,400 interactions with the public, including more than 240 inbound phone calls and emails since the end of January.
  - Completed the policy for IHA and took significant steps working toward implementation.
  - Received initial project submissions from PIER selection committees in 4 counties.
- Developed solicitations for state managed architectural and engineering, general contractor, and manufactured housing implementation (expected to be posted in the month of May).
- Prepared for Tier II by coordinating with key federal and state partners to overcome significant obstacles to speedy recovery for applicants.

In Q2 2024, the program will begin accepting and reviewing applications for HARP and moving applicants through the process. In addition, OHCS will release the three HARP construction procurements, move IHA closer to launch in the fall, and finalize HOP program design decisions.

#### COMPLIANCE AND PROCUREMENT TEAM:

In Q1, the compliance team finalized the annual subrecipient monitoring plan for current subrecipients and developed annual review checklists for HARP Outreach and Application Intake Support. From January 1 to March 30  $\tilde{A} \dot{c} \hat{A} \dot{c} \hat{A} \dot{c} \hat{a} \dot{c}$  the compliance team generated and conducted 17 training sessions with internal staff and subrecipients regarding CDBG-DR regulatory requirements around the HARP program and numerous one on one sessions with current subrecipients. Additionally, the compliance staff has been creating internal check lists to be used by program staff for all programs. The compliance team began internal controls review of DRR finance and is drafting a report and recommended changes and upgrades. Additionally, Compliance implemented weekly Compliance Office hours to provide technical assistance to OHCS Program Staff. Technical Assistance provided by the compliance team is entered into DRGR.

The procurement team has been developing PIER program master subrecipient agreements as well as IHA master subrecipient agreements in Q1. #### STATE-FUNDED RECOVERY WORK

In addition to undertaking program and policy development for CDBG-DR funds, DRR staff continues to program \$150 million



in state funding to support the recovery of wildfire-impacted households and communities. Results from that funding include:

- Rent assistance, purchase and repair grants and flexible assistance provided to 1,146 wildfire-impacted individuals through the Wildfire Recovery and Resilience Account (WRRA) \$35.3 million allocation. WRRA funding also helped 867 individuals achieve permanent housing.
- The development of over 200 permanent homes for wildfire survivors (another 569 affordable housing units with a wildfire preference and funded with tax credits and other state funding will be made available).
- Funding for the redevelopment and preservation of three destroyed affordable manufactured dwelling parks in Jackson and Lane Counties
- Largely thanks to the WRRA program, when FEMA closed down their Direct Housing Mission in spring 2023, 200 survivors had moved to temporary or permanent housing and no survivor households were forced out of FEMA shelters.
- Direct county allocations totaling \$19 million to fund community-driven projects, home replacement grants and land acquisition.

OHCS is currently working on 8 state projects that include preserved manufactured home parks, stick built town homes, single family lots, and a tiny home village. OHCS has a total of over 200 units that are currently being developed for wildfire survivors.

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#### Narrative:

OHCS is currently working with partners in impacted counties on the design of HOP, which will include incentives for the development of multiple types of new housing (single-family stick-built or pre-fabricated structures; attached single-family; resident/housing authority/non-profit-owned manufactured housing parks; and/or condominiums) that will be sold on affordable terms to eligible disaster-impacted survivors earning up to 120% of area median income, as well as down payment assistance. In coordination with county representatives through a meeting in February, OHCS has allocated funding for HOP amongst impacted counties based on their percentage of housing damage with a multiplier to account for increased construction costs in rural areas. OHCS is currently working on program design and writing policy in anticipation of HOP launch in late 2024/early 2025 after a successful launch of HARP and PIER.
