HB 2028 Rep Diehl (Presession filed)

Relating to funding for substance use services.

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study the funding formula under Ballot Measure 110 (2020).

HB 2047 Rep Wright (Presession filed)

Relating to parental rights.

Declares the state's public policy regarding the rights of a parent to the care, custody and control of the parent's child.

HB 2049 Rep Wright (Presession filed)

Relating to sex offenders.

Modifies when information about level two sex offenders and level one sex offenders may be released.

HB 2052 Rep McIntire (Presession filed)

Relating to truancy; declaring an emergency.

Creates a violation for failure to comply with compulsory school attendance requirements.

HB 2053 Rep McIntire (Presession filed)

Relating to the health of minors.

Creates the offense of a minor purchasing or attempting to purchase, possessing or attempting to possess or using in public an alternative nicotine product, inhalant delivery system or tobacco product.

HB 2101 Rep Osborne (Presession filed)

Relating to gangs.

Requires the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to study the possibility of creating a gang database.

HB 2104 Rep Osborne (Presession filed)

Relating to manslaughter in the second degree.

Expands the crime of manslaughter in the second degree to include circumstances in which a person delivers a controlled substance to another person on two or more occasions and the delivery results in the death of the other person.

HB 2142 Rep Boshart Davis (Presession filed)

Relating to controlled substances.

Requires a prison sentence for the unlawful delivery or manufacture of a controlled substance when the person has certain prior convictions.

HB 2172 Rep Helfrich (Presession filed)

Relating to concealed handoun license reciprocity; prescribing an effective date.

Directs the Department of State Police to create and maintain a list of states that recognize Oregon concealed handgun licenses and require a demonstration of handgun competency to obtain a license that is similar to the requirement in Oregon.

HB 2173 Rep Helfrich (Presession filed)

Relating to controlled substance crimes; prescribing an effective date.

Creates the crime of using a controlled substance in an enclosed place in a manner that endangers another person.

HB 2174 Rep Helfrich (Presession filed)

Relating to drug treatment; prescribing an effective date.

Requires that for certain drug and property crimes, the court must require an evaluation and treatment as a part of probation.

HB 2175 Rep Helfrich (Presession filed)

Relating to controlled substance crimes; prescribing an effective date.

Creates the crime of possessing, purchasing, making, delivering or selling a pill press or similar equipment.

HB 2179 Rep Helfrich (Presession filed)

Relating to school safety; prescribing an effective date.

Directs district school boards to adopt a policy to provide for the safety of the students of the school district, including the assignment of school resource officers or the provision of other law enforcement coverage for each school of the school district.

HB 2180 Rep Helfrich (Presession filed)

Relating to school safety; declaring an emergency.

Directs the Department of Education to conduct a study related to hiring retired police officers to provide security in public schools.

HB 2189 Rep Reschke (Presession filed)

Relating to traffic violations.

Provides that a person shall receive a written warning for a first offense of speeding or running a red light if the conduct was captured by photo radar or photo red light cameras.

HB 2191 Rep Reschke (Presession filed)

Relating to immigration enforcement; declaring an emergency.

Repeals the prohibition on the use of public resources to assist federal immigration enforcement.

HB 2196 Rep Reschke (Presession filed)

Relating to crimes involving minors.

Creates the crime of harmful communication with a minor.

HB 2230 Rep Osborne (Presession filed)

Relating to explicit digital forgeries.

Creates the crime of unlawful creation, possession, distribution or purchase of an explicit digital forgery in the first degree.

HB 2233 Rep Chotzen; Rep Fragala; Rep Gamba; Rep McLain; Rep Pham H; Rep Sanchez; Sen Gelser Blouin; Sen Taylor; Sen Woods (Presession filed)

Relating to public safety; declaring an emergency.

Directs the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to establish a program to provide legal services to assist adults in custody who are serving sentences at the Coffee Creek Correctional Facility.

HB 2250 Rep Andersen; Rep Chotzen; Rep Fragala; Rep McDonald; Rep Nelson; Rep Nosse; Sen Frederick; Sen Manning Jr; Sen Pham; Sen Prozanski (Presession filed)

Relating to redistricting.

Directs the Department of Corrections to determine the last-known address of adults in custody, if the address is readily known or available to an adult in custody, and submit information to the Portland State University Population Research Center.

HB 2255 Rep Diehl; Rep Wright; Rep Yunker; Sen Nash; Sen Robinson; Sen Smith DB (Presession filed)

Relating to interpretation of laws.

Provides that courts may not defer to an agency's interpretation of a statute or rule.

HB 2293 Rep Javadi; Rep Lewis; Rep Mannix; Rep Osborne; Rep Reschke; Rep Scharf; Rep Wright; Rep Yunker; Sen Thatcher (Presession filed)

Relating to pretrial incarceration.

Limits pretrial release of defendants charged with a felony or Class A misdemeanor to security release.

HB 2294 Rep Evans; Rep Mannix (Presession filed)

Relating to theft of firearms.

Directs the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to classify theft of a firearm as a crime category 8 offense on the sentencing guidelines grid of the commission.

HB 2296 Rep Mannix (Presession filed)

Relating to public defense; prescribing an effective date.

Directs the governing body of each county to coordinate the provision of public defense services within the county.

HB 2298 Rep Mannix; Rep Wallan (Presession filed)

Relating to expungements.

Modifies when a person can obtain an order setting aside a conviction, arrest, charge or guilty except for insanity judgment.

HB 2299 Rep Hartman; Rep Mannix; Rep McLain (Presession filed)

Relating to the unlawful dissemination of intimate images.

Increases the penalty for unlawful dissemination of an intimate image and renames the crime.

HB 2303 Rep Diehl; Rep Mannix (Presession filed)

Relating to judicial review of administrative rules.

Directs the courts to declare a rule invalid if the rule requires a public body to fail to comply with federal laws or regulations.

HB 2306 Rep Andersen; Rep Diehl; Rep Evans; Rep Mannix; Sen Patterson; Sen Thatcher (Presession filed)

Relating to courts.

Allows the Marion County board of county commissioners to establish a justice of the peace district that includes the county seat.

HB 2309 Rep Mannix; Rep Scharf (Presession filed)

Relating to change of name.

Requires an applicant for change of name who has been convicted of some crimes to prove necessity of name change by clear and convincing evidence.

HB 2310 Rep Mannix (Presession filed)

Relating to the rights of crime victims.

Requires district attorney offices to develop a victims' rights form and to provide the form to all victims upon initiation of a prosecution.

HB 2312 Rep Mannix (Presession filed)

Relating to staffing correctional facilities; prescribing an effective date.

Establishes the Task Force on Staffing at Correctional Facilities.

HB 2313 Rep Mannix (Presession filed)

Relating to the protection of health care workers.

Expands the crime of assault in the third degree to include causing physical injury to a health care worker while the worker is acting in the course of official duty.

HB 2315 Rep Mannix (Presession filed)

Relating to sex offender information.

Directs the Department of State Police to release sex offender information for level two sex offenders to certain entities on a website maintained by the department.

HB 2330 Rep Owens (Presession filed)

Relating to fraudulent schemes targeting the elderly; declaring an emergency.

Establishes the Task Force on Law Enforcement Interdiction Against Financial Scams on the Elderly.

HB 2331 Rep Owens; Sen Prozanski (Presession filed)

Relating to authority to delegate parental decision making.

Limits the right of a parent to delegate parental rights over a child who is in the care or custody of the Department of Human Services.

HB 2336 Presession filed (at the request of Governor Tina Kotek for Oregon Department of Administrative Services)

Relating to internal audits.

Modifies the timing of internal audits performed by state agencies and reporting on internal audits by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services.

HB 2360 Rep Levy B; Rep Smith G; Rep Wright; Rep Yunker; Sen Weber (Presession filed)

Relating to substance use disorders.

Authorizes the involuntary civil commitment of a person with a substance use disorder who meets the criteria for involuntary civil commitment of a person with a mental disorder.

HB 2383 Rep Evans; Rep Lively; Rep Mannix; Rep Nathanson; Rep Tran; Sen Gorsek; Sen Meek (Presession filed)

Relating to mass transit districts.

Authorizes the general manager of a mass transit district to appoint transit security officers to aid in the enforcement of mass transit ordinances.

HB 2396 Rep Breese-Iverson; Rep Levy B; Rep Osborne; Rep Reschke; Sen Nash; Sen Weber (Presession filed)

Relating to firearm purchase permits.

Provides that a person is automatically qualified to obtain a permit to purchase a firearm if the person holds a valid concealed handgun license.

HB 2397 Rep Levy B (Presession filed)

Relating to sex offender information.

Directs the Department of State Police to release sex offender information for level two sex offenders to certain entities on a website maintained by the department.

HB 2436 Rep Wright; Rep Yunker; Sen Nash; Sen Smith DB (Presession filed)

Relating to appointments in state government.

Provides that an official or agency of state government may not discriminate or grant preferential treatment to any individual on the basis of gender identity, race, sex, color, ethnicity or national origin in the application, selection or appointment of individuals to boards and commissions.

HB 2440 Rep Yunker; Sen Nash; Sen Smith DB; Sen Weber (Presession filed)

Relating to unauthorized use of real property.

Requires law enforcement to investigate and remove unlawful occupants upon declaration and payment of a fee by a property owner.

HB 2454 Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Rules for Representatives Ben Bowman, David Gomberg, Emily McIntire, Mark Owens, Nathan Sosa, Kim Wallan)

Relating to legislative oversight of executive branch actions; prescribing an effective date.

Authorizes the Joint Legislative Audit Committee to appoint a Legislative Audit Officer and to direct the officer to perform specified duties, including investigating, reviewing activities of and oversight of executive branch agencies, taking in and investigating complaints of members of the public concerning executive branch agency programs, conducting performance audits of executive branch agencies and reporting to the committee on work undertaken by the officer.

HB 2459 Rep Evans (Presession filed)

Relating to compensation of state employees.

Provides that, beginning on January 1, 2028, the annual salary or wages paid to an officer or employee of certain state agencies may not exceed 10 times the lowest annual salary or wages paid to a full-time officer or employee of the agency.

HB 2460 Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Judiciary for Oregon Law Commission)

Relating to local courts; prescribing an effective date.

Updates, reorganizes and modifies the provisions governing appeals from justice courts that have not become courts of record.

HB 2461 Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Judiciary for Oregon State Bar)

Relating to remote location testimony.

Changes notice requirements and requirements related to facilities and technology for motions to allow remote location testimony.

HB 2465 Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Judiciary for Federation of Oregon Parole and Probation Officers)

Relating to the authority of supervising officers.

Provides that the unlawful departure of a person from the custody of a parole and probation officer constitutes the crime of escape.

HB 2466 Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Judiciary for Oregon District Attorneys Association)

Relating to information sharing between state and federal authorities.

Allows a law enforcement agency or public body to provide information, or enter into an agreement to provide information, as required to effect an international extradition and return of a person charged with or convicted of a crime in this state and for whom a warrant of arrest has been issued.

HB 2467 Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Judiciary for National Alliance on Mental Illness) Relating to mental illness.

Defines "dangerous to self," "dangerous to others" and "serious physical harm" for the purpose of involuntarily committing a person with mental illness.

HB 2468 Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Judiciary for Association of Oregon Counties) Relating to discovery.

Provides that a district attorney may require the payment of a fee reasonably calculated to reimburse costs before providing discovery to a defendant.

HB 2469 Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Judiciary for Oregon Criminal Defense Lawyers Association)

Relating to criminal procedure.

Establishes a time limit on when a district attorney may submit an indictment to the grand jury on a pending case when a trial date has been scheduled.

HB 2470 Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Judiciary for Oregon District Attorneys Association)

Relating to mental health; prescribing an effective date.

Directs the Oregon Health Authority to expand the capacity of the Oregon State Hospital.

HB 2471 Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Judiciary for Oregon District Attorneys Association)

Relating to guilty except for insanity; prescribing an effective date.

Modifies when a person is guilty except for insanity.

HB 2472 Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Judiciary for Oregon Criminal Defense Lawyers Association)

Relating to juvenile offenders.

Shifts the burden of proof to the state during hearings on the issue of sex offender reporting by juvenile offenders.

HB 2473 Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Judiciary for Oregon District Attorneys Association)

Relating to criminal procedures; prescribing an effective date.

Modifies the requirements for providing a declaration for the purposes of authenticating records in response to criminal process.
