#### 5. Oregon Cultural Trust Strategic Plan and Tax Credit (10:00 a.m., Information)

Aili Shreiner, Cultural Trust Manager for Oregon Cultural Trust, will present and overview of the 2023-2027 Oregon Cultural Trust strategic plan and the Cultural Tax Credit. The Oregon Heritage Commission is one of the Oregon Cultural Trust's five statewide partners that receive a percentage of the funds distributed by the Trust each year to support the programs and services they provide across the state.

### **6. Northwest Digital Heritage** (10:20 a.m., Information)

Commission Coordinator will provide and update on Northwest Digital Heritage, a partnership of the Washington State Library, the Oregon Heritage Commission, and the State Library of Oregon, and serves as the primary service hub in the Pacific Northwest for the Digital Public Library of America's national discovery platform. In 2023 the Institute celebrated 25 years of preserving and sharing these important stories.
