- Teaches new/unknown information
- Explains changes in research/evolving understanding
- Supports critical thinking and evaluation of current issues
- Encourages identification of problems
- Provides tools for applying information
- Fosters relationship building through shared perspectives
- Assists communities in creating solutions

Build safer communities through information




## The CRR Process

- CRR: Community Risk Reduction
- 5 Step Process with sub-steps
- Multi-layered, multi-agency approach
- Identify and evaluate risks
- Foster relationships

# Differences: Education Vs. CRR

- Focus on interactions between people and ideas
- Community information with individual action
- Fosters buy-in for actions created through CRR



# Differences: Education Vs. CRR

- Focus identification of risks and hazards
- Community rather than individual actions
- Relies on education for community understanding



# Similarities: Education & CRR

- Focus on creating safer communities
  - Combined goals
  - Use same tools
  - Focus on audience
