# **Travel Safety Tips**

- EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS
  - Extra food and water for each family member & pets
  - First aid kit
  - Medications
  - Emergency contact information
  - Map of the area
  - Cell phone and charger or extra battery
    - Cell phones may not work or be reliable in remote areas



# **Leaving Your House Fire SAFE**

- DISCONNECT POWER TO ELECTRONICS
- CHECK TO MAKE SURE APPLIANCE HAVE BEEN TURNED OFF OR DISCONNECTED
- TURN OFF ALL AIR CONDITIONERS AND LOWER THE HEAT TO 60 DEGREES
- TURN OFF THE WASHER AND DRYER UNITS
- TURN OFF ALL LIGHTS
- DISPOSE OF ANY OILY RAGS IN A FIRE SAFE CONTAINER
- IF YOU HAVE A FIREPLACE/FIREPIT, ENSURE THAT ASHES ARE COMPLETELY COOLED

## Once you Get in your Hotel Room

- READ SAFETY INFORMATION PROVIDED
- PLAN ESCAPE AHEAD OF TIME, LOCATE EXITS TAKE TIME TO FIND THE EXITS AND COUNT THE NUMBER OF DOORS BETWEEN YOUR ROOM AND THE EXIT. MAKE SURE THE EXITS ARE UNLOCKED. IF THEY ARE LOCKED, REPORT IT TO HOTEL MANAGEMENT RIGHT AWAY.
- LOCATE NEAREST FIRE ALARM AND READ THE OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS
- KEEP YOUR ROOM KEY AND A FLASHLIGHT NEAR THE BED



## Once you Get in your Hotel Room

- IF ESCAPE IS NECESSARY, DON'T GO THROUGH THE SMOKE, GET LOW AND GO UNDER THE SMOKE TO YOUR EXIT.
- IF FIRE IS OUTSIDE YOUR ROOM AND YOU CAN'T ESCAPE:
  - Shut off fans and air conditioners.
  - Stuff wet towels in the crack around the door.
  - Call 911 and let them know your location.
  - Wait at the window and signal with a flashlight or light-colored cloth.
