Re: NOTICE OF SEIZURE OF VESSEL OR 496 MUB

Dear Mr. Harrol:

A Forder motorboat, 34' length, with Hull Identification Number 9749, registration number OR 496 MUB, was seized by the Oregon State Marine Board Friday, October 18, 2024. The enforcement agency served a pre-seizure notice to you, the owner, in a letter dated September 30, 2024. The deadline to prevent the seizure by either remedying the problem or requesting a hearing was 12:00 pm, October 14, 2024.



This vessel was seized under the authority of ORS 830.911 as a derelict vessel due to it being in imminent danger of sinking. The vessel is without current registration, ORS 830.770 and has been at anchor on state-owned submerged or submersible land for more than 30 contiguous days, OAR 141-082-0255(43). As the owner of the vessel, you may be cited for possession of a derelict vessel.

Oregon State Marine Board records indicate that you are the owner of this vessel. As the owner, you are liable for all costs arising from salvage, towing, storage and disposal. You may immediately reclaim your vessel by presenting proof of ownership and paying the salvage, towing, and storage cost that have accrued so far. The estimated charges are \$2,500.

You have the right to request a hearing to challenge the seizure of the vessel. If you wish to request a hearing, you must submit your request in writing to the OSMB not more than 10 days after the date of this notice. The deadline to request a hearing is:

12:00 pm, Monday, November 4, 2024

To prevent disposal of the seized vessel, you must reclaim the vessel and pay all accrued costs prior to:

12:00 pm, Monday, November 18, 2024

If you fail to reclaim the vessel prior to the date specified in this notice, the title to the vessel will be vested with the Oregon State Marine Board. The vessel will be destroyed, and you will remain liable for unpaid costs. The total cost of salvage, towing, storage and disposal is estimated to be \$2,500, but the final costs could be higher or lower than this estimate.
