Components of the Fiscal Impact

- Statement of Fiscal Impact
- Cost of Compliance



Statement of Fiscal Impact (ORS 183.335(2)(b)(E))

- Identifies <u>state agencies</u>, <u>units of local</u>
 government and the <u>public</u> that may be
 <u>economically effected</u> by proposed rule changes
- Estimates economic impact on those entities
- Uses <u>available information</u> to project significant economic effect of proposed rule changes on businesses, including the cost of compliance effects on <u>small businesses</u>



Fiscal Impact Analysis (ORS 183.335(2)(b)(E))

- Economic analysis but does not require original research by the agency
- Needs to address only the impact of the proposed rules on the status quo
- In the past, OWRD has done a qualitative analysis



Components of the Fiscal Impact

- Statement of Fiscal Impact
- Cost of Compliance



Components of the Cost of Compliance (ORS 183.336)

- Identify any state agencies, units of local government, and members of the public likely to be economically affected by the rule(s)
- 2. Cost of Compliance Effect on Small Business



Small Business (ORS 183.310(10)(a))

- Corporation, partnership, sole proprietorship or other <u>legal entity</u>
- Formed for purpose of making a profit
- <u>Independently</u> owned and operated from all other businesses
- <u>50 or fewer employees</u>.



Cost of Compliance Effect on Small Business (ORS 183.336)

- <u>Estimates number</u> of small businesses subject to new rules
- Identifies types of businesses subject to new rules
- Briefly describes projected <u>reporting</u>, <u>recordkeeping</u> and other administrative activities required for compliance with new rules, including costs of <u>professional services</u>
- Identifies <u>equipment</u>, <u>supplies</u>, <u>labor and increased</u> <u>administration</u> required for compliance with new rules
- Describes <u>how</u> agency proposing rules involved small businesses in rule development
- Uses <u>available</u> information



Limitation of Economic Effect on Small Businesses (OAR 137-001-0018)

- (1) Before the adoption of a permanent rule, the agency will determine whether the economic effect upon small business is significantly adverse, based upon
 - a) Fiscal Impact Analysis
 - b) Statement of cost of compliance
 - c) Recommendations from the Rules Advisory Committee
 - d) Comments made in response to its rulemaking notice
