On January 2, 2024, the February 22, 2024 Rulemaking Hearing public notice was sent out via GovDelivery to 4,378 rulemaking/adopted rules subscribers.

Interested parties were invited to sign up to provide oral testimony during the virtual hearing, encouraged to email written comments to [pharmacy.rulemaking@bop.oregon.gov](mailto:pharmacy.rulemaking@bop.oregon.gov) and had an opportunity to call in to listen to the hearing.

The rulemaking hearing convened at 9:30AM and adjourned at 9:33AM. #2 people joined the public call to listen to the hearing. Nobody signed up to provide oral testimony during the hearing. No written comments were received during the open comment period from 1/2/2024 through 4:30PM on 2/22/2024. The hearing was recorded, and the notice of proposed rulemaking filings were available on our website.

#### **RULES PROPOSED: Repeals Division 019 & 025 Vaccination rules**

REPEAL: OAR 855-019-0270, OAR 855-019-0280, OAR 855-019-0290, and OAR 855-025-0024.

- No oral testimony was provided.

All written comments received by the public comment deadline date of 2/22/2024 at 4:30PM **have been provided in their entirety** to the board (if applicable). Comments were received in response to the 1/2/2024 Notice of Proposed Rulemaking.

**Division 019 & 025: Pharmacists & Pharmacy Technicians (Repeal)**

**Filing Caption per ORS 183.335(2)(a)(A) (identifies the subject matter of the agency’s intended action max 15 words):** Repeals Division 019 and 025 Vaccination rules effective 2/29/2024

**Need for Rules per ORS 183.335(2)(b)(C) (describes what we are changing in rule):** Repeals rules in Division 019 Pharmacist and Division 025 Certified Oregon Pharmacy Technician and Pharmacy Technician rules related to vaccinations effective 11:59PM on 2/29/2024. The board adopted Division 115 Pharmacists rules in August, October and December 2023, which replace Division 019. The board adopted Division 125 Pharmacy Technicians rules in August 2023 and December 2023 which replace Division 025. Divisions 019 and 025 need to be repealed effective at 11:59PM on 2/29/2024 to allow Division 115 and 125 rules to become effective at 12:00AM on 3/1/2024. These repeals are being filed separately from the other Division 019 and 025 repeals due to limitations in the online rule filing system that would not permit the rules to be repealed until after amendments adopted by the board in December 2023 became effective on 1/1/2024.

A notice of rulemaking hearing will be sent to interested parties, some of whom may identify as a small business and will have an opportunity to provide public comment on the proposed rule repeal.

**Was a RAC consulted? If not, why? per ORS 183.335(2)(b)(G):** No. The board adopted new Division 115 Pharmacists rules in August, October and December 2023, effective 3/1/2024. The board adopted new Division 125 Pharmacy Technicians rules in August 2023 and December 2023, effective 3/1/2024. The nature of the proposed rule repeals does not require input from an advisory committee.

Division 025 needs to be repealed effective at 11:59PM on 2/29/2024 to allow Division 125 rules to become effective at 12:00AM on 3/1/2024.

102 prescribed by OHA within 15 days of administration.

104 (a) The name, address, gender and date of birth of the patient;

106 (b) The date of administration of the vaccine;

108 (c) The NDC number of the vaccine, or other acceptable standardized vaccine code set;

110 (d) The address of the pharmacy where vaccine was administered unless automatically embedded in the  
111 electronic report provided to the OHA ALERT Immunization System;

113 (e) The phone number of the patient when available;

114  
115 (f) The dose amount, manufacturer, site of administration, lot number and expiration date of the vaccine  
116 when available;

117  
118 (3) Keep documentation of current CPR training. This documentation will be kept on-site and available  
119 for inspection.

121 (4) Follow storage and handling guidance from the vaccine manufacturer and the Centers for Disease  
122 Control and Prevention (CDC).

124 (5) For the purpose of participation in the Oregon Vaccines for Children program,

126 (a) The vaccine eligibility code for each dose must be reported to the ALERT Immunization Information  
127 System in the manner prescribed by OHA, and

129 (b) The Pharmacist is recognized as a prescriber.

131 (c) If providing state or federal vaccines during a pandemic as determined by the CDC, the event and  
132 priority code as specified by OHA must be provided upon request in the manner prescribed by OHA.
