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JATC ADDS MATHEMATICS ENDORSEMENT

A Word from JATC Member, Nikki Tucker & EPP Partner Kevin Carr, Pacific University



Mathematics is among the high needs teaching areas identified by the U.S. Department of Education, along with science, special education, and bilingual education. Oregon shares these needs. Woodburn SD #103 (WSD), a regional leader in supporting biliteracy for all of its HS graduates, has a very high need for new middle and high school mathematics teachers with strong bilingual education skills.
