- 2 2. On March 16, 2017, the Commission received a report from the Clackamas County
3 Sheriff's Office containing information that White, while employed as a substitute
4 teacher with the NMSD, was under criminal investigation for possession of child
5 pornography on White's personal computer, including digital images and videos of a
6 minor aged female family member taken clandestinely. White was arrested and
7 charged with six felony sex crimes.

- 9 3. On September 26, 2018, White plead guilty to, and was convicted of, two counts of
10 ORS 163.686, Encouraging Child Sexual Abuse in the Second Degree, a Class C
11 Felony, and two counts of ORS 163.701, Invasion of Personal Privacy in the First
12 Degree, a Class C Felony. White was sentenced to 36 months supervised felony
13 probation, including the requirement that White register as a sex offender.

15 **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

16 Isaiah White' criminal convictions as described in section three (3) above,
17 constitute gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-
18 0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (*Use professional judgment*); and
19 OAR 584-020-0040(1) (*The Commission will deny, revoke or deny the right to apply*
20 *for a license or charter school registration to any applicant or educator who, has been*
21 *convicted of any of the crimes listed in ORS 342.143, or the substantial equivalent of*
22 *any of those crimes if convicted in another jurisdiction, or convicted of attempt to*
23 *commit such crimes as defined in ORS 161.405*), including ORS 163.686 –
24 *Encouraging Child Sexual Abuse in the Second Degree, and ORS 163.701 – Invasion of*
25 *Personal Privacy in the First Degree. This conduct also constitutes gross unfitness in*
26 *violation of ORS 342.175(1)(c); OAR 584-020-0040(5)(c) (*Conviction of violating any**

27 *federal, state, or local law. A conviction includes any final judgment of conviction by a*
28 *court whether as the result of guilty plea, no contest plea or any other means*); OAR
29 584-020-0040(5)(d) (*Commission of an act listed in OAR 584-020-0040(1)*); and OAR
30 584-020-0040(5)(e) (*Admission of or engaging in acts constituting criminal conduct,*
31 *even in the absence of a conviction*).

2 Pursuant to ORS 342.175(3) and OAR 584-020-0040(1) the Teacher Standards
3 and Practices Commission must revoke White’s license and / or his right to apply for a
4 license based on the conviction of any of the crimes listed in ORS 342.143(3)(a), or the
5 substantial equivalent of any of those crimes, or convicted of attempt to commit such
6 crimes as defined in ORS 161.405.

7
8 Furthermore, the conduct underlying White’s convictions as described in section
9 two (2) above, constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR
10 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (*Use professional*
11 *judgment*); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(f) (*Any sexual conduct with a student*) as defined by
12 OAR 584-020-0005(5); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(o) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-
13 0035(1)(c)(D) (*Honoring appropriate adult boundaries with students in conduct and*
14 *conversations at all times*); and OAR 584-020-0035(3)(a) (*Maintain the dignity of the*
15 *profession by respecting and obeying the law, exemplifying personal integrity and*
16 *honesty*). Additionally, White’s criminal convictions and conduct related to his
17 convictions constitute “gross unfitness” in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(c); OAR 584-
18 020-0040(3)(c) and (d) as defined by OAR 584-020-0040 (5) (*Gross unfitness is any*
19 *conduct which renders an educator unqualified to perform his or her professional*
20 *responsibilities*).

22 The Commission’s authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon
23 ORS 342.175.


24 **FINAL ORDER**

25 The Commission hereby revokes Isaiah White’s Oregon educator license and his
26 right to apply for an Oregon educator license.
