

STIPULATION OF FACTS

1. The Commission has licensed Schell since September 30, 2003. Schell holds a Professional Teaching License, with an endorsement in Art (PK-12), valid from July 12, 2018, through January 23, 2024. During all relevant times, Schell was employed by the Riverdale School District (RSD).
2. On May 3, 2018, the Commission learned Schell had been working as a full-time teacher for the RSD since January 23, 2017, with an expired license. Investigation determined that on January 22, 2015, and January 22, 2016, TSPC sent Schell reminders of his license's expiration date. On October 3, 2016, TSPC sent Schell a reminder his license was expiring on January 23, 2017. On October 19, 2019, TSPC received Schell's Professional Educational Experience Report (PEER) form. Schell explained that because TSPC had moved from a paper application to an online application, he believed TSPC would provide a confirmation on the submission of the PEER form. Schell said he planned on completing the online application after he received TSPC's confirmation. Schell said that while he waited on a confirmation from TSPC for the PEER form, he eventually forgot about completing the online application. When Schell learned of his error in early May 2018, he immediately applied for reinstatement of his license and was issued a Professional Teaching License on July 12, 2018.



CONCLUSION OF LAW

The conduct described above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (*Use professional judgment*), OAR 584-020-0040(4)(r) (*Working without a license*); and OAR 584-020-0035(1) (*Any person employed in a position in a school district, education service district, or charter school for which a license or registration is required pursuant*

1 to ORS Chapter 342, must hold a valid license or registration appropriate for assignment
2 while working as a public school, education service district or charter school employee).

4 The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon
5 ORS 342.175.

8 The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and
9 conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a Public Reprimand on David S. Schell's
10 Oregon educator license.


