7	On October 30, 2018, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission
8	(Commission) received a misconduct report from the Nestucca Valley School District
9	indicating possible professional misconduct on the part of licensed educator, Ronald K.
10	Smith (Smith).
11	After review of the matters alleged, Smith and the Commission agree that their
12	respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to
13	certain facts and the imposition of a public reprimand and a one (1) year period of
14	probation.
15	This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the
16	sanction to be imposed. In entering into this stipulation, Smith waives the right to a
17	hearing to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below.
18	By signing below, Smith acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to the
19	following: (i) he has been fully advised of his rights to notice and a hearing to contest the
20	findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally
21	waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of
22	Facts and Final Order of Public Reprimand and Probation (Stipulation and Final Order);
23	(ii) this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public
24	upon request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent
25	upon and subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does
26	not approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Smith nor the
27	Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) he has fully read this Stipulation and
28	Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) he voluntarily, without any force or
29	duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of
30	the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) he states that no promise or representation has
31	been made to induce him to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) he has
32	consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully
33	advised with regard to his rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with an
34	attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of
35	the Stipulated Final Order below.

## STIPULATION OF FACTS

- The Commission has licensed Smith since August 5, 1993. Smith holds a
  Professional Teaching License, with endorsements in Agriculture Science (PK12); Agriculture, Food and Natural Resource Systems: Agricultural Science and
  Technology (CTE) (PK-12); Career Trades: Generalist (PK-12) and Integrated
  Science (PK-12), valid from October 19, 2016, through November 8, 2021. During
  all relevant times, Smith was employed by the Nestucca Valley School District
  (NVSD).
  - 2. On October 30, 2018, the Commission received a report from the NVSD indicating Smith may have had engaged in conduct that may be considered gross neglect of duty and/or gross unfitness. Specifically, the report alleged Smith violated district policy by distributing performance enhancing substances to students at Nestucca Junior/Senior High School.
  - 3. Investigation determined that October 22, 2018, Smith brought a bag of nutritional and body building supplements in various forms to school. Smith believed the bag only contained protein powder and bars which Smith intended to share with students in his classes as he had done on multiple occasion over several years. The bag also including energy pills which, according to the manufacturer, contained 200 milligrams of caffeine in a single dose. Smith permitted students to take products from the bag as they wanted. Approximately twenty-five students obtained the products directly from the bag and some of these students provided these products to an unknown number of students. After the school received complaints of students having the products, Smith was placed on administrative leave while the district and law enforcement investigated the matter. The district found Smith violated NVSD policy GBEC Drug-Free Workplace, as it pertains to distributing performance enhancing substances. The NVSD issued Smith a letter of directive and unpaid leave for three and one half days.

1	CONCLUSION OF LAW
2	The conduct described above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS
3	342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use
4	professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable
5	rules and regulations).
6	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon
7	ORS 342.175.
8	
9	ORDER
10	The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and
11	conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a Public Reprimand on Ronald K.
12	Smith's Oregon educator license.
13	Furthermore, the Commission imposes a period of one (1) year of probation upon
14	Smith's licensure to commence from the date this order is signed by the Commission and
15	subject to the following condition:
16	1. Smith shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical Performance of
17	Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 584, Division
18	020.
