TODD) RIGHT TO APPLY 8 9 10 On October 23, 2023, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission 11 (Commission) issued an Amended Notice of Opportunity for Hearing to Michael N. 12 Todd, (Todd) in which the Commission charged him with Gross Neglect of Duty and /or 13 Gross Unfitness. The Notice was sent via U.S. First Class Mail and U.S. Certified Mail 14 Receipt 9589 0710 5270 0844 8660 98 to the address on file with the Commission. The 15 Notice designated the Commission file as the record for purposes of proving a prima 16 facie case. The Notice was confirmed as received by Todd's attorney of record at the 17 time, Aruna Masih. The Notice of Opportunity of Hearing, dated October 23, 2023, and 18 signed by Melissa Goff, Executive Director, stated: 19 20 "IF A REQUEST FOR HEARING IS NOT RECEIVED WITHIN THIS 21-DAY PERIOD, YOUR RIGHT TO A HEARING SHALL BE CONSIDERED WAIVED 21 22 UNLESS YOUR FAILURE TO REQUEST A HEARING WAS BEYOND YOUR 23 REASONABLE CONTROL. IF YOU DO NOT REQUEST A HEARING, 24 WITHDRAW YOUR REQUEST FOR HEARING, OR IF YOU FAIL TO APPEAR AT A HEARING, OR NOTIFY THE COMMISSION THAT YOU WILL NOT 25 26 APPEAR AT HEARING, THE COMMISSION WILL ADOPT AN ORDER OF 27 DEFAULT WHICH MAY INCLUDE THE REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION OF 28 YOUR LICENSE OR OTHER DISCIPLINE." 29 30 Per direction by Todd's current attorney, Margaret Olney, Todd has requested that this matter be resolved via a Default Order. The Commission, therefore, finds Todd 31 32 to be in default and enters the following findings of fact, conclusions of law, and final 33 order, based on the files and records of the Commission concerning this matter. 34 FINDING OF FACT 35 1. Todd has been licensed by the Commission since September 4, 2015. Todd held a 36 Preliminary Teaching License, with endorsements in Elementary Multiple Subjects 37 (PK-12) and Special Education – General (PK-12), valid from February 24, 2017 38 through April 21, 2020. Todd's license has since expired, and the Commission has no 39

renewal or licensure applications for him currently on file. During all relevant times Todd was employed by Portland Public Schools (PPS) as an elementary school teacher at Creston Elementary School.

2. On March 5, 2019, the Commission received a misconduct report from PPS alleging that on September 19, 2018, PPS staff received a phone call from the United States Department of Homeland Security (DHS) notifying the district that Todd was being criminally investigated by DHS for possession of child pornography.

Per PPS records, on September 19, 2018, PPS Legal Counsel, Mary Kane was notified by Federal Immigration and Customs Enforcement Special Agent, Travis Jones that Todd was under investigation for purchasing and viewing illegal child pornography online, via personal computer, outside of school on several dates in 2018. Agent Jones and Kane remained in contact while the criminal investigation was conducted, and Agent Jones relayed to Kane that on September 19, 2018, Todd used his credit card to purchase access to an online fee-based illegal juvenile pornography website. The purchase allowed Todd to view several electronic images of "semi-nude and fully nude pre-pubescent minors." (Both male and female.) Agent Jones advised Kane that Todd's credit card had also been used to make additional purchases for access to child pornography in January and February 2018, while Todd was employed with PPS. Agent Jones reported to Kane that Todd had admitted to purchasing/viewing illegal juvenile pornography in the past, "4-5 years ago." This would have included the time frame Todd was employed with PPS. (Todd's employment with PPS started in 2015.) On April 18, 2019, Agent Jones advised Kane that a search of Todd's electronic devices yielded no illegal pornographic material. Agent Jones reported to Kane that the search of Todd's electronic devices "showed evidence of child pornography in the cache files" but also showed evidence that the electronic evidence had been "purged" using a software program called "C-Cleaner" several days prior to federal investigators visiting his residence in Beaverton, Oregon. As a result, federal prosecutors declined to prosecute or indict Todd on federal charges of possession or distribution of child pornography. PPS requested that Todd participate in an interview related to this investigation, and upon advice of his attorney of record at the time, Ralph Wiser, he declined to participate. PPS terminated Todd's employment on June 26, 2019.

3. On March 15, 2021, Commission investigative staff requested that Todd participate in an interview regarding this matter. On March 16, 2021, the Commission received an email response from Todd's attorney, Ralph Wiser, declining the interview request. On March 17, 2021, the Commission sent a response to Mr. Wiser, acknowledging Todd's desire not to participate in an interview, and advising Todd that failure to participate in an interview could be interpreted by the Commission as you failing to cooperate with a TSPC investigation under OAR 584-020-0040. On March 18, 2021, the Commission received an email response from Mr. Wiser, acknowledging this information, and reiterating once again that Todd did not wish to participate in an interview with TSPC.

1	CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
2	The conduct as described in section two (2) above, constitutes gross neglect of
3	duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates
4	OAR 584-020-0010(5) (<i>Use professional judgment</i>). This conduct also constitutes gross
5	unfitness in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(c); and OAR 584-020-0040(5)(e) (Admission
6	of or engaging in acts constituting criminal conduct, even in the absence of a
7	conviction). Your conduct
8	
9	The conduct as described in section three (3) above, constitutes gross neglect of
10	duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates
11	OAR 584-020-0010(5) (<i>Use professional judgment</i>); and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(p)(
12	Subject to the exercise of any legal right or privilege, failure or refusal by an educator
13	under investigation to respond to requests for information, to furnish documents or to
14	participate in interviews with a Commission representative relating to a Commission
15	investigation).
16	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based
17	upon ORS 342.175.
18	FINAL ORDER
19	The Commission hereby revokes Todd's Oregon teaching license and revokes his
20	right to apply for a license.
