7	On November 15, 2019, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission		
8	(Commission) received a report from Oregon Department of Human Services indicating		
9	Paul W. Smith (Smith) may have committed acts of gross neglect of duty and/or gross		
10	unfitness, specifically, violation of teacher/student boundaries. On December 2, 2019,		
11	the Commission received a report from the Clackamas Education Service District		
12	(District) indicating Smith may have committed acts of gross neglect of duty and/or		
13	gross unfitness, specifically, violation of teacher/student boundaries		
14	After review of the matters alleged, Smith and the Commission agree that their		
15	respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to		
16	certain facts, the imposition of a thirty (30) day suspension, and a two (2) year period of		
17	probation.		
18	This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the		
19	sanction to be imposed. Smith stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in the		
20	Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law set		
21	forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Smith waives the right to a hearing to		
22	contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below.		
23	By signing below, Smith acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to the		
24	following: (i) he has been fully advised of his rights to notice and a hearing to contest the		
25	findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally		
26	waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of		
27	Facts and Final Order of Suspension and Probation (Stipulation and Final Order); (ii)		
28	this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public upon		
29	request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent upon and		
30	subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does not		
31	approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Smith nor the		
32	Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) he has fully read this Stipulation and		
33	Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) he voluntarily, without any force or		
34	duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of		

the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) he states that no promise or representation has

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been made to induce him to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) he has consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully advised with regard to his rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with an attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below.

STIPULATION OF FACTS

- The Commission has licensed Smith since July 18, 2007. Smith holds a
 Professional Teaching License, with an endorsement in Special Education:
 Generalist (PK-12), valid from January 5, 2017, through January 25, 2022.
 During all relevant times, Smith was employed by the Clackamas Education
 Service District (CESD).
- 2. On November 15, 2019, the Commission received information from the Oregon Department of Human Services (DHS) alleging Smith was forming an inappropriate relationship with a 6-year-old student. On December 2, 2019, the Commission received a report from CESD indicating Smith may have committed acts which constitute gross neglect of duty and/or gross unfitness. Specifically, the CESD reported that during the 2018-2019 and 2019-2020 school years, Smith had behaved inappropriately by failing to maintain physical boundaries with students in general and failed to maintain teacher/student boundaries with a first-grade student.
- 3. Investigation determined that towards the beginning of the 2018-19 school year, Smith was contacted by the parent of EV, a kindergarten student, who was enrolled in Smith's Happy Valley Elementary School (HVES) Life Enrichment Education Program (LEEP) classroom. The parent told Smith that at EV's previous school, EV would come home upset and the parent expressed concern this would continue at EV's new school. Smith told the parent he would attempt to make EV's classroom environment a fun place to learn and the experience happy. Smith discussed with the parent EV's likes and dislikes, and ways to implement more opportunities for the things EV liked. The parent shared that EV enjoyed watching episodes of a child-oriented video series. Smith said he often would watch the beginning of one of these videos with EV at the start of the day because it improved EV's demeanor throughout the day and was also effective at deescalating EV when she was upset.

4. In late fall and early winter of the 2018-2019 school year, the District received multiple complaints from staff at HVES regarding Smith's behavior with students. In November 2018, a staff member reported physical boundary concerns between Smith and students in the LEEP that school year. Smith was observed picking up students, rubbing students' backs and ticking students. Students were observed attempting to sit on Smith's lap, and leaning and pushing against him. In December 2018, Smith told a CESD representative looking into the concerns that he did interact physically with the students to make the classroom a fun environment. Smith told the representative that he did not feel bad about holding the hand of EV because it made her feel more secure at school. The representative provided Smith suggestions for appropriate techniques for physical contact with students.

- 5. On March 11, 2019, a different staff member complained to the CESD about Smith's continuing relationship with EV. Smith was observed spending significant class time working one-on-one with EV while non-licensed staff were unsupervised and expected to instruct other students without assistance. Smith was observed referring to EV with nicknames such as "princess" and "princess of the classroom". During an IEP meeting later in the school year, EV's mother noted how happy EV was at school and how EV's parents encouraged EV to think of Smith as a family member. No attendees of the meeting, including Smith's supervisor, made any mention of this being inappropriate.
- 6. In Smith's District interview, Smith explained EV's mother hosted a party at school to celebrate EV's birthday. The party included a cake, party decorations, and a princess party hat for EV. Smith reported that after that party, he and staff sometimes referred to EV as "Princess". Smith was often observed holding EV's hand at recess and escorting EV alone on walks. Smith explained the student needed support on the stairs and on the uneven surface of the playground. Smith said he later delegated other staff to supervise the student during these times. In May 2019, another staff member reported that Smith's behavior with students and EV had not changed.
- 7. On September 24, 2019, a staff member complained to the CESD about Smith's behavior with EV. Smith was observed on the playground with EV, who was no longer in Smith's class, where EV was pulling on Smith's shirt and holding his hand. Smith did not attempt to discourage or separate himself from EV. Further

- 1 CESD investigation found EV had developed an emotional attachment to Smith 2 which caused staff to be concerned
 - 8. Smith reported EV's parent shared with him that EV was happy at school, but there was some tension between the EV and the EA. Smith unsuccessfully attempted to communicate the issue with the EA. This caused difficulties in the relationship between Smith and the EA. Smith then referred the matter to his supervisor. Smith said his supervisor never responded back on the matter.
 - 9. On November 14, 2019, information of Smith's alleged interactions with students was reported to DHS, and on November 15, 2019, the CESD placed Smith on administrative leave. On January 10, 2020, a CESD investigation found Smith violated district policy regarding student boundaries and issued him a Reprimand and accompanied with directives for appropriate teacher/student boundaries. Smith was also given written expectations regarding student interactions. On January 16, 2020, Smith was reassigned to Rock Creek Middle School (RCMS).
 - 10. During Smith's first week at RCMS in January 2020, the CESD received multiple complaints from staff regarding their concerns of boundary issues between Smith and students. Smith was observed allowing students to grab his arms and hands without redirecting them, and on one occasion, an aide had to redirect a student who was attempting to sit on his lap. Smith was observed to be "overly affectionate" with students and used "baby talk" when interacting with some of the students. Smith was observed engaging in a face-to-face hug with a student in which the student wrapped one of their legs around his leg and an aide had to intervene. Smith's supervisor reminded Smith of appropriate behavior and that his students were in middle school and not elementary school. The CESD investigated these concerns and on January 30, 2020, issued Smith a Reprimand and a two-day suspension without pay.

3	342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(1)	
4	(Recognize the worth and dignity of all persons and respect for each individual), OAR	
5	584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using	
6	district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(0) as it	
7	incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(1)(c)(A) (Not demonstrating or expressing	
8	professionally inappropriate interest in a student's personal life), and OAR 584-020-	
9	0035(1)(c)(D) (Honoring appropriate adult boundaries with students in conduct and	
10	conversations at all times).	
11	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon	
12	ORS 342.175.	
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14	ORDER	
15	The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and	
16	conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a thirty (30) day suspension upon Paul	
17	W. Smith's Oregon educator license.	
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19	Furthermore, the Commission imposes a period of two (2) years of probation	
20	upon Smith's licensure to commence upon reinstatement of Smith's Oregon educator	
21	license and subject to the following condition:	
22	Smith shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical Performance of	
23	Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 584, Division 020.
