3 4 5 6 7	In the Matter of the Control Stipulation of Facts Educator License of Stipulation of Facts ANDREW J. DEYOE AND REVOCATION OF RIGHT TO APPLY
8	On March 17, 2020, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (Commission)
9	received information from the Oregon Department of Human Services indicating Andrew J.
10	DeYoe (DeYoe) may have committed acts of gross neglect of duty and/or gross unfitness,
11	specifically, that DeYoe engaged in inappropriate teacher/student boundaries and sexual
12	conduct with a student.
13	After review of the matters alleged, DeYoe and the Commission agree that their
14	respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to certain
15	facts, revocation of DeYoe's Oregon educator license, and revocation of DeYoe's right to apply
16	for an Oregon educator license.
17	This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the sanction to be
18	imposed. DeYoe stipulates that there are sufficient evidence contained in the Commission's files
19	and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law set forth below. In entering
20	into this stipulation, DeYoe waives the right to a hearing to contest the findings of fact,
21	conclusions of law and order set forth below.
22	By signing below, DeYoe acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to the
23	following: (i) he has been fully advised of his rights to notice and a hearing to contest the
24	findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally waives all
25	such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of Facts and Final
26	Order of Revocation and Revocation of Right to Apply (Stipulation and Final Order); (ii) this
27	Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public upon request by the
28	Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent upon and subject to approval
29	and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does not approve and adopt this
30	Stipulation and Final Order, then neither DeYoe nor the Commission are bound by the terms
31	herein; (iv) he has fully read this Stipulation and Final Order, and understands it completely; (v)
32	he voluntarily, without any force or duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and
33	consents to issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) he states that no
34	promise or representation has been made to induce him to sign this Stipulation and Final Order;
35	and (vii) he has consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has

been fully advised with regard to his rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with

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1 an attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of the 2 Stipulated Final Order below. 3 4 STIPULATION OF FACT 5 1. Andrew J. DeYoe has been licensed by the Commission since August 5, 2014. DeYoe held a Preliminary Teaching License, with an endorsement in English Language Arts (PK-12), valid 6 7 from July 8, 2017, through September 20, 2020. During all relevant times, DeYoe was 8 employed by the Athena-Weston School District. 9 10 2. On March 17, 2020, the Commission received information from the Oregon Department of Human Services (DHS) indicating DeYoe may have committed acts which constitute gross 11 12 neglect of duty and/or gross unfitness. The information from DHS alleged DeYoe engaged in 13 inappropriate teacher/student boundaries and sexual conduct with a minor-aged student. 14 15 3. Investigation determined that during the first half of the 2019-2020 school year, DeYoe and 16 a female high school student began exchanging texts and communicating through social 17 media accounts. On November 2, 2019, while on a trip school trip for a sporting event, DeYoe and the student were alone in DeYoe's hotel room for several hours. On several 18 19 occasions during the fall of 2019, DeYoe had physical contact with the student while they 20 were in DeYoe's classroom. DeYoe and the student continued to communicate by text 21 messages. In December 2019, the student backed away from interactions with DeYoe which 22 ended the relationship. 23 4. On October 6, 2020, in an interview with TSPC, DeYoe admitted that in the 2017-2018 24 25 school year, he met the student and almost instantly bonded with her. DeYoe said he got to know the student well. DeYoe admitted that in conversations with the student, she would 26 27 share details of her home life, family and boyfriend. 28 29 5. On May 21, 2020, DeYoe was accused by the Umatilla County District Attorney of two (2) misdemeanor counts of Sexual Abuse in the Third Degree. These charges were later 30 dropped. On September 2, 2020, DeYoe was accused by the Umatilla County District 31 Attorney of two (2) misdemeanor counts of Harassment for unlawfully and intentionally 32 harassing or annoying the student by subjecting the student to offensive physical contact by 33

touching intimate parts of her body. On September 3, 2020, in the Circuit Court for the

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1	County of Umatilla, DeYoe plead guilty to the two (2) counts of harassment and was
2	sentenced. As part of DeYoe's plea agreement, he was required to forfeit his teaching license.

12	Andrew J. DeYoe's conduct as described above, constitutes gross neglect of duty in
13	violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-
14	0010(5) (Use professional judgment) and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(0) as it incorporates, OAR
15	584-020-0035(1)(c)(A) (Not demonstrating or expressing professionally inappropriate
16	interest in a student's personal life); OAR 584-020-0035(1)(c)(D) (Honoring appropriate adult
17	boundaries with students in conduct and conversations at all times); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(f)
18	(Any sexual conduct with a student).
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20	Your conduct as described above, constitutes gross unfitness in violation of ORS
21	342.175(1)(c); OAR 584-020-0040(3)(c) and (d) as defined by OAR 584-020-0040 (5) (Gross
22	unfitness is any conduct which renders an educator unqualified to perform his or her
23	professional responsibilities); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(f) (Any sexual conduct with a student) as
24	defined by OAR 584-020-0005(5); and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(0) as it incorporates OAR 584-
25	020-0035(1)(c)(D) (Honoring appropriate adult boundaries with students in conduct and
26	conversations at all times)
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28	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon ORS

32	The Commission hereby revokes Andrew J. DeYoe's Oregon educator license and revokes
33	his right to apply for an educator license.
