9	On December 23, 2021, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission
10	(Commission) issued a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing to Alanna C. Crabaugh
11	(Crabaugh) in which the Commission charged Crabaugh with Gross Neglect of Duty.
12	The Notice was sent via U.S. First Class Mail and U.S. Certified Mail Receipt 7021 0350
13	0000 8183 8114 to the address on file with the Commission. The Notice designated the
14	Commission file as the record for purposes of proving a prima facie case. The Certified
15	Mail receipt was not returned to the Commission, and assumed delivered. The regular
16	First Class letter mail was not returned to the Commission, and assumed delivered. The
17	Notice of Opportunity of Hearing, dated December 23, 2021, and signed by Anthony
18	Rosilez, Executive Director, stated:
19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29	"IF A REQUEST FOR HEARING IS NOT RECEIVED WITHIN THIS 60-DAY PERIOD, YOUR RIGHT TO A HEARING SHALL BE CONSIDERED WAIVED UNLESS YOUR FAILURE TO REQUEST A HEARING WAS BEYOND YOUR REASONABLE CONTROL. IF YOU DO NOT REQUEST A HEARING, WITHDRAW YOUR REQUEST FOR HEARING, IF YOU FAIL TO APPEAR AT HEARING, OR NOTIFY THE COMMISSION THAT YOU WILL NOT APPEAR AT HEARING, THE COMMISSION WILL ADOPT AN ORDER OF DEFAULT WHICH MAY INCLUDE THE REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION OF YOUR LICENSE OR OTHER DISCIPLINE."
30	Crabaugh did not request a hearing. The Commission, therefore, finds Crabaugh
31	to be in default and enters the following findings of fact, conclusions of law, and final
32	order, based on the files and records of the Commission concerning this matter.
33	
34	FINDINGS OF FACT
35	1. Crabaugh applied for licensure with Commission. Crabaugh digitally signed and
36	submitted an application for a Charter School Registry-Teaching, on February 3,
37	2020. Crabaugh's application was pended until resolution of this matter

1	2. As part of the application process, Commission staff conducted a routine
2	background check. On July 8, 2020, staff conducted a criminal background check
3	and noted several arrest and convictions which Crabaugh had also reported in
4	her written response to character questions on her application. The matter was
5	referred to the Commission's Professional Practices unit for further investigation.
6	
7	3. A Commission investigator attempted to contact Crabaugh in September 2021, to
8	arrange an interview. The interview was to cover the information from
9	Crabaugh's background which would allow the Commission to more thoughtfully
10	assess her fitness to hold an Oregon teaching license or Charter School Registry.
11	Crabaugh failed to respond to multiple requests for an interview with
12	Commission investigative staff.
13	
14	CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
15	Alanna C. Crabaugh's conduct described above constitutes gross neglect of duty
16	in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as incorporates OAR 584-
17	020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment); and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(p) (Subject to
18	the exercise of any legal right or privilege, failure or refusal by an educator under
19	investigation to respond to request for information, to furnish or to participate in
20	interviews with a Commission representative relating to a Commission investigation).
21	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon
22	ORS 342.175.
23	
24	FINAL ORDER
25	The Commission hereby denies Alanna C. Crabaugh's application and suspends
26	Alanna C. Crabaugh's right to apply for an Oregon educator license for a period of thirty
27	(30) days.
