3 4 5 6 7	In the Matter of the STIPULATION OF FACTS AND Educator License of FINAL ORDER OF SUSPENSION GREGORY M. WILCOX	
8	On February 6, 2023, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission	
9	(Commission) received an internal complaint alleging possible professional misconduc	
10	on the part of licensed educator, Gregory M. Wilcox (Wilcox). The complaint alleges th	
11	while teaching at North Medford High School (NMHS) Wilcox offered students \$100.0	0
12	to complete the Cinnamon TikTok challenge. On or about January 6, 2023, a student	
13	accepted your offer and agreed to do the cinnamon challenge. Upon attempting the	
14	challenge, the student required medical attention from the school nurse.	
15	After review of the matters alleged, Wilcox and the Commission agree that their	
16	respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to	0
17	certain facts and the imposition of a thirty (30) day suspension of Wilcox's Oregon	
18	educator's license.	
19	This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the	
20	sanction to be imposed. Wilcox stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in the	e
21	Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law se	et
22	forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Wilcox waives the right to a hearing to	
23	contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below.	
24	By signing below, Wilcox acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to	
25	the following: (i) he has been fully advised of his rights to notice and a hearing to conte	st
26	the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally	
27	waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of	f
28	Facts and Final Order of Suspension and Probation (Stipulation and Final Order); (ii)	
29	this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public upon	
30	request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent upon an	nd
31	subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does not	
32	approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Wilcox nor the	
33	Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) he has fully read this Stipulation and	
34	Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) he voluntarily, without any force or	

duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of

2	been made to induce him to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) he has

5	attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry o

8		STIPULATION OF FACTS			
9	1.	The Commission has licensed Wilcox since September 21, 2017. Wilcox currently			
10		holds a Preliminary CTE Teaching License with endorsements in Culinary CTE.			
11		The license was issued on July 28, 2020 and expires on March 4, 2024. During			
12		all relevant times, Wilcox was employed by the Medford School District. (MSD).			
13		the state of the s			
14	2.	On February 6, 2023, Chief Human Resources Officer Janel Reed of the MSD			
15		filed a school misconduct report with TSPC. The report alleged that Wilcox, a			
16		teacher at NMHS had offered students \$100.00 to complete the cinnamon			
17		TikTok challenge. The report alleged that Wilcox had made the offer to students			
18		on or about January 6, 2023. Student HC, a special needs student accepted the			
19		offer and agreed to do the cinnamon challenge. The misconduct report alleges			
20		that once HC accepted the challenge, Wilcox measured out an amount of			
21		cinnamon on a spoon and handed to HC. HC immediately began to choke and			
22		struggled to breathe. The report states that student HC received medical			
23		attention from the school nurse.			
24					
25		On January 9, 2023, TSPC received a DHS cross report about this same incident			
26		that cited the same facts listed above.			
27					
28	3.	According to district documentation and a TSPC investigation, the following			
29		occurred relevant to the above-listed complaint:			
30					
31		The TikTok Cinnamon Challenge is a popular food consumption challenge			
32		that has gone viral on the internet in recent years. Participants in the			
33		challenge eat a spoonful of ground cinnamon in under 60 seconds without

challenge eat a spoonful of ground cinnamon in under 60 seconds without

drinking any fluids or water. The challenge is potentially dangerous as a

1		result of the cinnamon powder coating the inside of the mouth, throat and
2		lungs. Coughing, gagging, vomiting, difficulty breathing are side effects of
3		participating in this challenge.
4		• On January 6, 2023, after using cinnamon in the preparation of Bananas
5		Foster, some students started talking about the TikTok Cinnamon Challenge.
6		Wilcox repeatedly stated that it could not be done and, according to Wilcox,
7		jokingly offered to pay students \$100.00 if they were successful. Wilcox
8		explained that, at the time, he was unaware of any serious health risks.
9		NMHS Assistant Principal Mayra Garcia (Garcia) was in the classroom when
10		Wilcox made the offer and heard him tell the students "it's impossible.
11		Cinnamon is insoluble. No one can do the cinnamon challenge."
12		• One student, HC, seemed particularly intent on trying. HC is a special needs
13		student in Wilcox's culinary program. Wilcox explained that he decided to
14		measure out the cinnamon and provide it to HC in class so that the challenge
15		would be done in a controlled environment.
16		<ul> <li>HC began coughing and spitting after she tried swallowing the cinnamon.</li> </ul>
17		said that "it hurts to breath." Wilcox was at her side at the sink and told her
18		that "I told you no one can do it."
19		<ul> <li>NMHS Assistant Principal Mayra Garcia (Garcia) was also in the classroom,</li> </ul>
20		and also assisted HC after she attempted to swallow the cinnamon.
21		Garcia took HC outside to get some fresh air and then started to head to the
22		nurse's station.
23		<ul> <li>Wilcox checked in with HC during the next class period and told her that if</li> </ul>
24		her parents had any questions, they should call.
25		<ul> <li>On January 31, 2023, the MSD issued Wilcox a letter of reprimand and on-</li> </ul>
26		day unpaid suspension for offering students \$100 to complete the cinnamon
27		challenge and giving student HC the spoonful of cinnamon.
28		
29	4.	On May 2, 2023, TSPC investigative staff interviewed Wilcox via telephone. Also
30		present during the interview was his attorney, Margaret Olney. During the
31		interview Wilcox took responsibility for his actions and confirmed the events
32		listed above. Wilcox reported that he was only kidding about the bet and had no
33		intention of paying or receiving \$100. Wilcox reported that he was only trying to
34		provide a teachable moment to the students; that cinnamon is insoluble. Wilcox

1	reported that he was unaware of how dangerous the cinnamon challenge was
2	until after this incident when he did some research. Wilcox reported that after he
3	discovered how dangerous it was, he decided he would never give cinnamon to a
4	student again.

16 17 18 19 20 21	The conduct described above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-20-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0020(2)(d) (Skill in the supervision of students), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations).
23	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon
24	ORS 342.175.
25	ORDER
26	The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and
27	conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a suspension of Wilcox's Oregon
28	educator license for a period of thirty (30) days.
