15	completion to the Commission.
16	Whereas after reviewing the evidence submitted by Mr. Mueller along with his personal
17	statement to the Commission, the Commission agrees to the reinstatement of Tony Mueller's
18	Oregon educator license and the reinstatement of Mr. Mueller's right to apply for any Oregon
19	educator license that he may be eligible for. The Commission commends Mr. Mueller's
20	commitment to self-improvement and professional development as demonstrated by his
21	completed training and reflection paper.
22	Now therefore, the Commission orders that Tony Mueller's Oregon educator license and
23	Mr. Mueller's right to apply for an Oregon educator license is reinstated effective November 14,
24	2016.

BEFORE THE TEACHER STANDARDS AND PRACTICES COMMISSION 1 2 OF THE STATE OF OREGON 3 DEFAULT ORDER OF 4 In the Matter of the 5 6 LICENSE REVOCATION Teaching License of TONY ALAN MUELLER 7 On February 1, 2012, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (Commission) 8 issued a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing to Tony Alan Mueller (Mueller) in which the 9 Commission charged him with Gross Neglect of Duty pursuant to ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-10 020-0040(4)(n), OAR 584-020-0010(5), OAR 584-020-0015(2)(e), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(a), 11 OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e), OAR 584-020-0040(4)(d), OAR 584-020-0040(4)(e), and gross 12 unfitness in violation ORS 342.175(1)(c); OAR 584-020-0040(5)(e). The Notice was sent via 13 U.S. First Class Mail and U.S. Certified Mail Receipt 7009 1410 0002 1925 3198 to the address 14 on file with the Commission. The Certified Mail was signed for on February 2, 2012. The regular 15 mail was not returned to the Commission. The Notice of Opportunity of Hearing, dated February 16 1, 2012, and signed by Victoria Chamberlain, Executive Director, stated: 17 "IF A REQUEST FOR HEARING IS NOT RECEIVED WITHIN THIS 21-DAY PERIOD. 18 YOUR RIGHT TO A HEARING SHALL BE CONSIDERED WAIVED UNLESS YOUR 19 FAILURE TO REQUEST A HEARING WAS BEYOND YOUR REASONABLE 20 CONTROL. IF YOU DO NOT REQUEST A HEARING OR IF YOU FAIL TO APPEAR 11 AT A HEARING, THE COMMISSION WILL ADOPT AN ORDER OF DEFAULT WHICH :2 MAY INCLUDE THE REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION OF YOUR LICENSE OR 23 OTHER DISCIPLINE." 24 25 Mueller did not request a hearing. The Commission, therefore, finds Mueller to be in default and 26 enters the following findings of fact, conclusions of law and order, based on the files and records 27 of the Commission concerning this matter. 28 FINDINGS OF FACT 29 1. Tony Alan Mueller has been licensed as a teacher in Oregon since August 4, 1989. His 30 current Basic Teaching License, issued on February 23, 2011, is valid until February 22, 31 2014. During all relevant times Mueller was employed by Parkrose Public School District. 32 2. On February 17, 2011, Mueller struck a thirteen-year-old student (HG) with a clipboard by 33 throwing the clipboard at the student from a distance of several feet. The clipboard struck 34 HG in the back, knocking him to the ground where he lay injured and crying. The incident 35 left a visible scratch and red mark on HG's back. Mueller failed to check on HG to determine 36 if he was injured or required help. Mueller's conduct was witnessed by the other students in 37 the class. Mueller was subsequently charged with the crime of Harassment for his conduct. 38

Mueller entered into an agreement with the courts, allowing him court diversion. After

- Mueller completed the required community service and other conditions, his case was dismissed.
 - 3. Mueller demonstrated a pattern of behaviors involving inappropriate physical contact with students and corporal punishment dating back to 2004. This includes at least three additional incidents dating from 2004 until the incident cited above in section 2. These incidents include Mueller inappropriately physically escorting a student by pulling his arm and wrist causing pain, escorting a student by grabbing his backpack and shoulder while pulling him to the office, and throwing a basketball, overhand and with enough force at a student, to cause that student to fall to the ground crying. This incident occurred approximately two weeks prior to the clipboard incident mentioned in section two (2) of this document and involved the same student, HG. Mueller throwing the basketball in this manner caused pain and injury to HG and was witnessed by other students. Management attempted to correct Mueller's inappropriate behavior by providing Mueller with additional training and workshops, documentation of incidents and issued directives and discipline.

15 CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

On February 17, 2011, Tony Allen Mueller willfully struck a student with a clipboard causing injury; this was not the first time Mueller imposed corporal punishment upon a student. This conduct constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5)(Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0015(2)(e)(Skill in the selection and use of teaching techniques conducive to student learning); OAR 584-020-0025(2)(a)(Establishing and maintaining classroom management that is conducive to learning), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e)(Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(d)(Unreasonable physical force against students, fellow employees, or visitors to the school, except as permitted under ORS 339.250); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(e)(Violent or destructive behavior on school premises or at a school-sponsored activity). This conduct also constitutes gross unfitness in violation ORS 342.175(1)(c); OAR 584-020-0040(5)(e)(Admission of or engaging in acts constituting criminal conduct, even in the absence of a conviction).
