BEFORE THE TEACHER STANDARDS AND PRACTICES COMMISSION 1 2 OF THE STATE OF OREGON STIPULATION OF FACTS AND 3 In the Matter of the FINAL ORDER OF SUSPENSION 4) **Teaching License of** 5 OF LICENSE) MARY JEAN IOVINO 6 On or about October 13, 2011, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission 7 (Commission) received a report from the Bend-LaPine School District that Mary Jean 8 Iovino may have violated Standards for Competent and Ethical Performance of Oregon 9 Educators related to a laptop computer owned by the school district. 10 After review of the matters alleged, Iovino and the Commission agree that their 11 respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to 12 certain facts and the imposition of a 90 day suspension of Iovino's Standard Teaching 13 14 License. By signing below, Iovino acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to 15 the following: (i) she has been fully advised of her rights to notice and a hearing to 16 contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and 17 finally waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this 18 Stipulation of Facts and Final Order of Suspension of License (Stipulation and Final 19 Order); (ii) this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the 20 public upon request to the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is 21 contingent upon and subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the 22 Commission does not approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither 23 Iovino nor the Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) she has fully read this 24 Stipulation and Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) she voluntarily, without 25 any force or duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance 26 and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) she states that no promise or 27 representation has been made to induce her to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and

- 1 (vii) she has consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and
- 2 has been fully advised with regard to her rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to
- 3 consult with an attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and
- 4 issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below.

STIPULATION OF FACTS

- 6 1. The Commission has licensed Iovino as a teacher in Oregon since January 9, 1995.
- 7 Iovino's current Standard Teaching License, with an endorsement in Standard
- 8 Elementary (preK-Grade 9), issued on May 31, 2011, is valid until May 30, 2016.
- 9 During all relevant times, Iovino was employed by the Bend-LaPine School District,
- 10 for sixteen years.
- 11 2. In approximately 2006, the district assigned Iovino and other district educators,
- laptops to be taken back and forth from school to home. The district also maintained
- laptops on carts for use by students and other staff. All district laptops were heavily
- 14 used.

- 15 3. In approximately the spring of 2010, the operating system on Iovino's laptop crashed
- and the laptop was regularly malfunctioning. The district refused to replace Iovino's
- 17 laptop. Therefore, without permission from the district, Iovino borrowed one of the
- 18 laptops from the carts.
- 19 4. In January of 2011, the district sent two emails advising staff that two computers
- were missing from the carts and requesting that all laptops taken from the carts be
- returned. Records indicate Iovino opened one of the two emails on November 17,
- 22 2010 at 9:07 am and the other email was not opened. Iovino did not return the
- 23 laptop she had taken from the carts, nor did she inform the district that it was in her
- possession, because it had crashed at her house and she stated she was worried she
- would get into trouble. The other missing laptop was returned.
- 26 5. In approximately March of 2011, the district reported to the School Resource Officer
- 27 that a laptop was still missing from the carts and had not been returned in response
- to the all-staff emails.
- 29 6. On March 7, 2011, the School Resource Officer questioned Iovino about the missing
- laptop. At that time, Iovino was forthcoming with the officer and agreed to go home
- 31 and bring in the laptop.
- 32 7. Iovino resigned from her position with the district effective August 18, 2011.

10	Iovino unlawfully retained a District laptop. This conduct constitutes gross neglect of
11	duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584
12	020-0010(5) (Use of professional judgment) and OAR 584-020-0025(2)(b)(Use of District
13	property) and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(0) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(4)(a)(Use of
14	District Equipment).
15	ORDER
16	The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and
17	conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a 90 day suspension on Mary Jean
18	Iovino's Standard Teaching License.
