11	been aware that Brenda Pine did not hold a valid Oregon Teaching License.		
12	5. As Superintendent of Butte Falls School District Steven Pine assigned Brenda		
13	Pine to serve as a substitute teacher in the Butte Falls School District on 59 separate		
14	days beginning September 12, 2002, through May 21, 2003.
