7	On or about March 21, 2001, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission
8	(Commission) received a report from Lavonne Bush, Superintendent, Neah-Kah-Nie
9	School District indicating that Randy Schild, a licensed administrator and building
10	principal, participated in receiving and sending emails over the district email system
11	which were inappropriate and potentially hurtful to other staff members.
12	Mr. Schild fully cooperated with the Commission's investigation and did not
13	contest the allegations. After review of the matters alleged, Mr. Schild and the
14	Commission agree that their respective interests, together with the public interest, are
15	best served by a stipulation to certain facts, a thirty (30) day suspension of his
16	Administrative License and a one (1) year period of probation. Mr. Schild understands
17	that the probation will be subject to specific conditions. This Order sets forth the facts
18	upon which the parties have agreed and the sanction to be imposed. In entering into
19	this stipulation, Mr. Schild waives the right to a hearing to contest the finding of fact,
20	conclusion of law and order set forth below.
21	STIPULATION OF FACTS
22	1. Mr. Schild holds a Standard Teaching License valid June 22, 1999 through
23	June 1, 2002, with Standard General Business Education; Office Systems; and Account
24	and Financial Systems Endorsement. Mr. Schild holds a Basic Administrative License

- valid May 29, 1996 through June 1, 2001. The Commission has continually licensed 1 2 Mr. Schild since July 1, 1974. There are no prior complaints on file. 3 2. The Commission's disciplinary action impacts Mr. Schild's Basic Administrative License. The Commission takes no action against his Standard 4 5 Teaching License in this matter. 6 3. Mr. Schild is employed by Neah-Kah-Nie School District as Principal of Neah-7 Kah-Nie Jr/Senior High School. He began his employment with the District in 1998. 8 4. Beginning in 1999, District-owned computers with email access were present 9 in all Neah-Kah-Nie Jr/Senior High School classrooms for educator use in connection with 10 assigned responsibilities. 11 5. The District has a clearly defined, acceptable use policy that has been in force since January 8, 1996. The District's acceptable use agreement declares that 12 13 information in email messages is not private to the individual sending or receiving the 14 correspondence; that the District is a public entity and all correspondence is done on 15 public property and on public equipment; and that all correspondence should meet the 16 standards of the District and the School Board 17 6. Mr. Schild used his classroom computer to send and receive inappropriate 18 email messages to other staff members in the building using the District's email service.
- A student intercepted and read an inappropriate email as a result of his activities.

 7. Mr. Schild admits that he should not have used the District computer for sending or receiving inappropriate email messages and has expressed remorse for

7	8. Mr. Schild has never denied his actions with the School District or TSPC. He
2	has accepted responsibility and acknowledges his mistake. The District has disciplined
3	Mr. Shield for his inappropriate use of District email.
4	ULTIMATE FINDING OF FACT
5	Randy Schild used the computer equipment owned by his employer, Neah-Kah-
6	Nie School District, located on school premises, to send and receive inappropriate email
7	messages. Mr. Schild was fully aware that sending and receiving inappropriate email
8	messages using District owned computer equipment was inappropriate and in violation
9	of District policy.
10	CONCLUSION OF LAW
11	Randy Schild's activities constitute gross neglect of duty in violation of OAR 584-
12	020-0040(4)(a) and OAR 584-020-0010(5).
13	This stipulation is contingent upon approval and adoption of the Order by the
14	Commission. If the Commission does not adopt this Order, neither Mr. Schild nor the
15	Commission are bound by these Stipulations and Mr. Schild retains all rights to a
16	hearing on the allegations.

2	The Oregon Basic Administrative License, certificate number 915869 issued to
3	Randy Harold Schild is suspended for a period of thirty (30) days beginning on July 1,
4	2001. At the end of the suspension period of thirty (30) days, Mr. Schild's Basic
5	Administrative License will be reinstated upon complete application for reinstatement.
6	Furthermore, the Commission imposes a one (1) year probation upon Mr. Schild subject
7	to the condition that he comply with all Standards for Competent and Ethical
8	Performance under Chapter OAR 584, Division 020.
9	Violation of the terms of this probation may constitute an independent basis for
10	the Commission to impose discipline, up to and including revocation of Mr. Schild's
11	teaching license subject to Mr. Schild's right to a hearing on the issue of whether he
12	violated probation.
