7	The Teacher Standards and Practices Co	ommission (Commission) issued a Notice of		
8	Opportunity for Hearing on March 11, 2003, to Belle K. Hirsch, proposing to impose discipline			
9	under ORS 342.177. On April 23, 2003, the Commission issued an Amended Notice of Hearing.			
10	Ms. Hirsch has requested a hearing. After a review of the matters alleged, Ms. Hirsch and the			
11	Commission have agreed that their respective interests, together with the public interest, are best			
12	served by a stipulation to certain facts and the suspension of Ms. Hirsch's license, followed by a			
)3	period of probation.			
14	In entering into this stipulation, Ms. Hir	sch waives her right to a hearing and understands		
15	that the Commission will suspend her teaching license for a period of nearly one year. This			
16	stipulation and order are contingent upon approval by the full Commission. If the Commission			
17	does not approve this stipulation and proposed	order, it is understood that any waiver of rights by		
18	Ms. Hirsch is therefore revoked. It is further ur	nderstood that the statements contained in this		
19	stipulation may not be used by either the Comm	nission or Ms. Hirsch for any reason if the		
20	Commission fails to approve this stipulation an	d proposed order.

\mathcal{L}_2	October 1979).	
3	2.	Ms. Hirsch has been employed as an elementary school teacher with the Eagle	
4	Point School	District for 19 years. She resigned her position with the district, effective June 12,	
5	2002.		
6	3.	During the 2001-2002 school year, Ms. Hirsch taught a combined fourth, fifth and	
7	sixth grade classroom at the Glen D. Hale Elementary School. In April, she administered the		
8	Oregon Statewide Knowledge and Skills Assessment to the students in her classroom. The		
9	protocols for	administration of the test required that the persons administering the test be neutral	
10	and not provi	de any assistance to a student that could give away the correct answer.	
14	4.	While administering the mathematics portion of the test, Ms. Hirsch reviewed the	
12	answers of he	er students and circled certain questions that she selected from the test booklets. For	
3	these questio	ns, Ms. Hirsch urged the students to think harder about their answers.	
14	5.	Many of the students changed their answers following the prompting by Ms.

22	Belle K. Hirsch failed to remain neutral and violated the testing protocol for the Oregon		
23	Statewide As	ssessment by circling questions in the test booklets and suggesting to students that

OAR 584-020-0040(4)(o) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(2)(b) and 584-020-0035(3)(a). 3 DISCUSSION 4 Teachers have an important obligation to maintain the integrity of the Oregon Statewide 5 Knowledge and Skills Assessment. While Ms. Hirsch's actions may have been well intended, 6 they had the effect of compromising the integrity and the accurateness of her student's scores. 7 This could undermine an important purpose of the statewide assessment. For this reason, a 8 suspension of Ms. Hirsch's teaching license is warranted. 9 **ORDER** 10 The Oregon Teaching License of Belle K. Hirsch is suspended for a period beginning 11 with the date of this order and continuing through July 31, 2004. Upon expiration of the period 12 of suspension and timely application for reinstatement under OAR 584-050-0015, Ms. Hirsch's teaching license shall be reinstated, and she shall be placed on probation for a period of two 14 years, subject to the following conditions: 15 Ms. Hirsch shall comply with all Standards for Competent and Ethical 16 1. Performance under OAR 584 Division 20. 17 Ms. Hirsch shall strictly comply with all test protocols and requirements of any 2. 18 19 statewide assessment she administers. Ms. Hirsch shall promptly inform the Commission in writing if she is placed on 3. 20 leave for disciplinary reasons from any teaching job or if she is terminated from any teaching 21

they reconsider their answers. This conduct constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of
