6	On or about November 20, 2002, the Teacher Standards and Practices
7	Commission (Commission) received an application for renewal of a Standard Teaching
8	License from Shelley Ann Martin (Martin). Ms. Martin reported a criminal conviction on
9	the character question section of Application for Educator License Form C-1.
0	Ms. Martin fully cooperated with the Commission's investigation. After review of
1	the facts in this matter, Ms. Martin and the Commission agree that their respective
2	interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to certain
3	facts, the imposition of a Public Reprimand followed by a four (4) year probation. This
4	Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the sanction to be
5	imposed. Ms. Martin stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in the
6	Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law set
7	forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Ms. Martin waives the right to a hearing to
8	contest the findings of fact, conclusion of law and order set forth below. Ms. Martin
9	understands that the probation will be subject to specific conditions.
20	Shelley Ann Martin enters into this Stipulation of Facts with the knowledge that
21	the Commission shall place her on probation for a period of four (4) years. This
22	Stipulation is contingent upon approval and adoption of the Order by the full
23	Commission. If the Commission does not adopt this Order, neither Ms. Martin nor the

Commission are bound by these stipulations and Ms. Martin retains the right to a hearing on the allegations.

STIPULATION OF FACTS

- Ms. Martin's Standard Teaching License expired on October 6, 2002. On
 November 20, 2002, the Commission received a complete application for renewal of a
 Standard Teaching License from Ms. Martin.
- Ms. Martin is currently employed as a .5 FTE Math Teacher at Glenco High
 School, Hillsboro School District.
 - 3. On December 13, 2000, Ms. Martin was convicted of Child Neglect II in Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Washington County. The police report indicates that Ms. Martin left her five-year old son locked in a vehicle outside a bar for one hour while she was inside consuming alcohol at 11:30 p.m., on April 28, 2000. Ms. Martin pled guilty to one charge of Child Neglect II. The Court suspended imposition of sentence and placed Ms. Martin on formal probation for two years requiring 40 hours community service and alcohol evaluation and treatment.
 - 4. Ms. Martin successfully completed an inpatient alcohol treatment program at Parkview Chemical Dependency in Parkview, Colorado on March 2, 2001.
 - 5. On June 19, 2001, Ms. Martin was convicted for Probation Violation in Washington County Circuit Court for leaving the State without written permission from her Probation Officer. On February 15, 2002, Ms. Martin was convicted for Probation Violation in Washington County Circuit Court for failure to submit documentation that she had completed the community service hours as sentenced.

	6. Ms. Martin recognizes that she has an alcohol dependency problem and has
2	agreed to a plan of treatment and aftercare as prescribed by her treatment provider.

9	CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
10	Shelley Ann Martin violated OAR 584-020-0040(5)(c) regarding her conviction for
11	Child Neglect II and OAR 584-020-0040(5)(f) regarding convictions for Probation
12	Violation. This misconduct constitutes Gross Unfitness. The Commission's authority to
13	impose discipline in this matter is based upon ORS 342.175.

ORDER The Commission authorizes the renewal of a Standard Teaching License and 3 imposes a Public Reprimand on Ms. Martin. This Stipulation of Facts, Order and Probation constitutes the Reprimand. Furthermore, the Commission imposes a four (4) 4 5 year probation upon Ms. Martin subject to the following terms and conditions: 6 1. Ms. Martin shall conduct herself as a law-abiding citizen; 7 2. Ms. Martin shall report in writing within ten days to the Executive Director of 8 the Commission any arrest or citation for any felony, misdemeanor, or major traffic

3. Ms. Martin shall, at her own initiative and expense, continue to obtain treatment for her alcohol dependency as recommended by her alcohol treatment provider and abstain from the consumption of alcohol.

violation:

- 4. During the period of her probation, Ms. Martin shall submit to the Executive Director of the Commission reports of her compliance with the treatment plan. Ms. Martin shall provide these reports to the Commission every six (6) months during this probation, on or before: November 9, 2003, May 9, 2004, November 9, 2004, May 9, 2005, November 9, 2005, May 9, 2006, November 9, 2006, and May 9, 2007.
- 5. Ms. Martin shall comply with all Standards for Competent and Ethical Performance under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 584, Division 020.

If Ms. Martin does not comply with his treatment plan based on the reports of her treatment provider or as otherwise determined by the Executive Director she shall be in violation of the terms of this probation. Violation of the terms of this probation may constitute an independent basis for the Commission to impose discipline, up to and

	including revocation of Ms. Martin's teaching license subject to Ms. Martin's right to	a
_2	hearing on the issue of whether she violated probation.
