1 BEFORE THE TEACHER STANDARDS AND PRACTICES COMMISSION 2 OF THE STATE OF OREGON 3 In the Matter of the STIPULATION OF FACTS AND **Educator License of**) IAL ORDER OF SUSPENSION 5 SAM R. LEACH AND PROBATION 6 On or about January 8, 2015, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (Commission) 7 received a patron complaint alleging that Sam R. Leach (Leach) had violated Professional Standards 8 and Practices. On March 23, 2015, the Commission received an additional patron complaint further 9 alleging unprofessional behavior by Leach. 10 After review of the matters alleged, Leach and the Commission agree that their respective 11 interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to certain facts, the 12 imposition of a four (4) month suspension of Leach's Oregon educator license, and a two (2) year 13 period of probation to commence upon reinstatement of Leach's Oregon educator license. 14 This document sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the stipulated 15 sanction to be imposed. Leach stipulates that there is sufficient evidence in the Commission's files 16 and records to support the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below. 17 By signing below, Leach acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to the following: 18 (i) he has been fully advised of his rights to notice and a hearing to contest the findings of fact, 19 conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally waives all such rights and any rights 20 to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of Facts and Final Order of Suspension and 21 Probation (Stipulation and Final Order); (ii) this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and 22 disclosed to the public upon request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is 23 contingent upon and subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does 24 not approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Leach nor the Commission are 25 bound by the terms herein; (iv) he has fully read this Stipulation and Final Order, and understands it 26 completely; (v) he voluntarily, without any force or duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order

and consents to issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) he states that no promises

or representation has been made to induce him to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) he

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1 has consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully advised

2 with regard to his rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with an attorney prior to

3 entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order

4 below.

STIPULATION OF FACTS

- 1) Leach has been licensed as an Educator in Oregon since February 7, 2000. Leach holds an Initial II Teaching License, with an endorsement in Multiple Subjects Self-Contained (ECE, ELE) is valid from September 19, 2013, through September 15, 2016. Leach also holds an Initial Administrator license, with an endorsement in Administrator (ALL LVL), which is valid from July 22, 2014, through September 18, 2017. Leach has made timely application for renewal of his licenses, and the expiration of Leach's licenses was stayed, pending the outcome of commission investigation(s). During all relevant times, Leach was employed by the Portland Public School District.
- 2) On January 8, 2015, the Commission received a patron complaint alleging Leach had, during the 2012-2013 school year, violated professional standards related to classroom management and the verbal, mental and physical abuse of students. On March 23, 2015, the Commission received an additional patron complaint further alleging unprofessional behavior with students. Investigation identified the following unprofessional conduct:
 - a) During the 2012-2013 school year, student teacher Crockett, was assigned to Leach's third grade classroom. Crockett reported to the Department of Human Services (DHS) and to another teacher who then reported to school administrators that Leach was physically and mentally abusive to students. Crockett described Leach's classroom management style as abusive, stating Leach would yell, belittle, insult and isolate children. Crockett advised that Leach had told him "the key to establishing control in the classroom was to make a child cry in the first week of school", which Crockett stated Leach quickly accomplished. Crockett further stated that Leach would forcibly grab students by the shoulders, move them to the location Leach wanted and/or forcibly pushed them down into chairs. Crockett described the children as wincing in pain when Leach grabbed them.

Crockett described an incident where Leach forcibly removed a bag of plums from a student who was passing them out for snack. Leach yelled at the student and threw the bag of fruit out the doorway and into the hall where it smashed into the lockers. Leach then yelled at the student to go and clean up the mess. This event was also witnessed by another teacher who had been in the hallway area. Leach's conduct was reported to school officials and DHS. DHS did not pursue any action, and Leach's principal evaluated Leach's performance in the Spring of 2013 favorably.

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- b) During the 2013-2014 school year, at his request, Leach was reassigned to a kindergarten classroom, which was his first time teaching kindergarten. Leach found the classroom management strategies he had used for third graders were ineffective with kindergarteners and requested assistance from administration. During the fall of 2013, multiple staff complaints about Leach's inappropriate interactions with students were filed with school administrators. District officials conducted an investigation, including interviews of other teachers and students. Students reported that Leach grabbed students forcibly, pushed students against lockers, or into chairs, yelled at students, made students cry, shook students, left students unattended in the hallway for time outs, and shamed students as punishment. Teachers reported similar conduct, including witnessing Leach grab students, forcibly move students, yell at students, pushing students to the ground, shaming students, and making students cry. In meetings with school officials, Leach admitted to raising his voice, shaking his finger in frustration at students, and placing kindergarten students in the hallway unattended for time outs. During interviews with commission investigators, Leach admitted to lifting students by the arms, being frustrated and angry at students, grabbing students inappropriately, and using a voice level/tone that was too strong for kindergarten students. Leach admitted his conduct was not appropriate and was a violation of district policies.
- c) On January 2, 2014, school officials issued Leach a "Final warning and notice of a 3-day, unpaid disciplinary suspension" for his conduct. Leach was voluntarily reassigned as the Student Management Specialist at another school for the 2014-2015, 2015-2016 school years.

1	After that position was reduced for funding reasons, Leach applied for and was hired to
2	become the School Climate Coach (formerly known as Student Management Specialist) for
3	another school for the 2016-2017 and 2017-2018 school years.
4	3) Leach has had no complaints or concerns since his January 2014 discipline.

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14	CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
15	Sam R. Leach 's conduct described above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS
16	342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(1) (Recognize the
17	worth and dignity of all persons and respect for each individual), OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use
18	professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0020(2)(d) (Skill in the supervision of students), OAR 584-
19	020-0025(2)(a) (Establishing and maintaining classroom management that is conducive to
20	learning), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations),
21	OAR 584-020-0030(2)(b) (Skill in communicating with administrators, students, staff, parents, and
22	other patrons), and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(d) (Unreasonable physical force against students, fellow
23	employees, or visitors to the school, except as permitted under ORS 339.250).
24 25 26	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon ORS 342.175.
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1	ORDER
2	The Commission hereby adopts and incorporates herein the above stipulation of facts,
3	conclusions of law, and based thereon hereby imposes a four (4) month suspension upon Leach's
4	Oregon educator license as follows:
5	Sam R. Leach's Oregon educator license is hereby suspended for four (4) months following the
6	adoption of this order.
7	Furthermore, the Commission imposes a two (2) year period of probation upon Leach to
8	commence upon reinstatement of his Oregon educator license and subject to the following terms and
9	conditions of probation:
10	1. Leach shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical Performance of
11	Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 584, Division 020.
12	2. Leach will successfully complete a Commission approved training related to Classroom
13	Management and/or Student Safety and Welfare within the first year of probation.
14	Violation of any term or condition of probation shall constitute an independent basis for the
15	Commission to revoke Leach's Oregon educator license or otherwise impose discipline, after first
16	providing Leach with notice and opportunity for hearing
