## 1 BEFORE THE TEACHIS STANDARDS AND PRACTICES COMMISSION 2 OF THE STATE OF OREGON 3 In the Matter of the STIPULATION OF FACTS AND 4 **Educator License of** FINAL ORDER OF REPRIMAND 5 CHESTER JOHN NOVITT :) AND PROBATION 7 On or about June 23, 2017, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission 8 (Commission) received a report from the Beaverton School District (District or BSD) 9 indicating possible professional misconduct on the part of licensed educator Chester 10 John Novitt (Novitt). 11 After review of the matters alleged, Novitt and the Commission agree that their 12 respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to 13 certain facts, the imposition of a Public Reprimand, and a period of probation. 14 This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the 15 sanction to be imposed. Novitt stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in the 16 Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law set 17 forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Novitt waives the right to a hearing to 18 contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below. 19 By signing below, Novitt acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to the 20 following: (i) he has been fully advised of his rights to notice and a hearing to contest the 21 findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally 22 waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of 23 Facts and Final Order of Reprimand and Probation (Stipulation and Final Order); (ii) 24 this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public upon 25 request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent upon and 26 subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does not 27 approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Novitt nor the 28 Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) he has fully read this Stipulation and 29 Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) he voluntarily, without any force or 30 duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of 31 the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) he states that no promise or representation has 32 been made to induce him to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) he has 33 consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully

advised with regard to his rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with an

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attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and isuance and entry of
 the Stipulated Final Order below.

## STIPULATION OF FACTS

- The Commission has licensed Novitt since July 29, 1994. Novitt holds a
  Professional Teaching License, with endorsements in Biology (PK-12), Integrated
  Science (PK-12), and World Language: Japanese (PK-12), valid from August 9,
  2017 through August 8, 2022. During all relevant times, Novitt was employed by
  the Beaverton School District.
- 2. June 23, 2017, the Commission received a report from the BSD advising that Novitt may have committed act(s) that constitute gross neglect of duty. In April and May of 2017, the BSD received multiple student reports about Novitt's grading and record keeping practices. BSD officials determined Novitt's conduct included a pattern of improper grading practices dating back to the 2015-2016 school year.

In June 2016, Principal Sica met and discussed with Novitt an incident where Novitt awarded a student full credit for an assignment the student submitted that contained nonsensical material unrelated to the assignment. The student did not receive any feedback but still received a "4" on the assignment.

On April 28, 2017, the BSD issued Novitt a memo of concern concerning various grading irregularities from the 2016-2017 school year. The District cited its finding that Novitt had given a student a proficiency score of "4" on an assignment, where the student had turned in a nonsensical text of an animated film that had been sent through Google translate numerous times. Novitt maintains that he required hard copy submission of that assignment for actual grading purposes, that he did grade a responsive hard copy of the assignment, and that the grade he entered reflected that work, not the upload. The District further found that Novitt had entered unverified grades from a peer-graded assessment, where students had inappropriately boosted each others' grades. The District also found that the grade mark distribution for Novitt's biology class was unusually high in comparison with individual students' work in other classes, causing the district to be concerned that the grades might not be an accurate reflection of student learning.

After issuing the preceding memorandum, the District learned of new allegations of improper grading and conducted further investigation. The District

determined that Novitt had entered grades for a March 24, 2017 exam for six students who had in fact missed the exam to attend a robotics competition, and for one student who had been travelling. It also determined that Novitt had entered grades for an April 6, 2018 group presentation for students who missed the presentations and/or ran out of time to give presentations. Novitt maintained that he had given presentations grades based upon other work compléted prior.

Following the additional investigation, BSD officials determined Novitt repeatedly failed to accurately and fairly assess and report grades as required by BSD policy. On June 8, 2017, Novitt was placed on administrative leave pending a termination recommendation to the school board. Novitt later resigned his employment with the BSD.

## **CONCLUSION OF LAW**

The conduct described above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0015(2)(b) (Skill in setting instructional goals and objectives expressed as learning outcomes), OAR 584-020-0015(2)(e)( Skill in the selection and use of teaching techniques conducive to student learning), OAR 584-020-0020(2)(a) (Multiple ways to assess the academic progress of individual students), OAR 584-020-0020(2)(b) (Skill in the application of assessment data to assist individual student growth), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using and maintaining student records as required by federal and state law and district policies and procedures), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations), and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(c) (Falsification of any document or knowing misrepresentation directly related to licensure, employment, or professional duties).

5	The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and
6	conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a Public Reprimand on Chester John
7	Novitt's Oregon educator license.
8	Furthermore, the Commission imposes a two (2) year period of probation upon
9	Novitt's licensure to commence from the date this order is signed by the Commission
10	and subject to the following conditions:
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12	1. Novitt shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical Performance
13	of Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 584, Division
14	020.
