





1 **STIPULATION OF FACTS**

- 2 1. The Commission has licensed Alley since September 4, 2007. Alley's Preliminary  
3 Teaching License, with endorsements in Business: Generalist (PK-12), Family  
4 and Consumer Studies (PK-12), and Social Studies (PK-12); is valid from March  
5 30, 2016, through September 13, 2019. During all relevant times, Alley was  
6 employed by the North Clackamas School District (NCSD).
- 7 2. On August 26, 2016, the Commission received a report alleging Alley may have  
8 violated professional standards. Subsequent investigation was unable to  
9 substantiate the original allegation, but in the course of the inquiry, investigators  
10 discovered additional conduct on Alley's part that caused concern. This conduct  
11 included an incident occurring on or about April 27, 2016. Alley, with  
12 authorization, attempted to use the school district P-card to purchase food  
13 supplies for class. The P-card was rejected and Alley elected to use his own credit  
14 card for the purchase. Alley submitted a request for reimbursement the same day,  
15 provided the receipt, and requested reimbursement for the full amount totaling \$  
16 577.37. On April 29, 2016, Alley followed up on his request for reimbursement  
17 with office staff. Alley was informed the request would be processed soon and  
18 were asked to confirm the amount was correct (\$577.37), which Alley confirmed.  
19 Staff then asked if Alley had returned any of the items purchased. Alley  
20 reportedly hesitated, pulled another receipt from his pocket, and told staff he had  
21 returned some of the items purchased. The return receipt indicated that \$83.84  
22 worth of items were returned to the store and credited to Alley's credit card  
23 account. The return transaction was conducted on the same date of the purchase,  
24 approximately 1.5 hours later. Alley told staff he had forgotten to turn in the  
25 refund receipt. Alley elected to resign his employment while NCSD was  
26 investigating Alley for policy violations, including inappropriate use of district  
27 funds.

**CONCLUSION OF LAW**

The conduct described above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (*Use professional judgment*), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(d) (*Using district and school business and financial procedures*), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (*Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations*), OAR 584-020-0030(2)(b) (*Skill in communicating with administrators, students, staff, parents, and other patrons*); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(o) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(2)(e) (*Not use the district's or school's name, property, or resources for non-educational benefit or purposes without approval of the educator's supervisor or the appointing authority*), and OAR 584-020-0035(3)(a) (*Maintain the dignity of the profession by respecting and obeying the law, exemplifying personal integrity and honesty*).

The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon ORS 342.175.

**ORDER**

The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a Public Reprimand on David Lee Alley's Oregon educator license.
