) STIPULATION OF FACTS AND
 FINAL ORDER OF PUBLIC
 REPRIMAND AND PROBATION

On February 3, 2016, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (Commission) received a district report alleging Diana Lucas (Lucas) may have engaged in professional misconduct when she misplaced confidential student material in violation of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and district policy. On March 15, 2017, the Commission received a district report alleging Lucas had violated professional standards and local policy related to classroom management and improper student restraints.

After review of the matters alleged, Lucas and the Commission agree that their respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to certain facts, the imposition of a Public Reprimand, and a period of probation.

This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the sanction to be imposed. Lucas stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in the Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law set forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Lucas waives the right to a hearing to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below.

By signing below, Lucas acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to the following: (i) she has been fully advised of her rights to notice and a hearing to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of Facts and Final Order of Public Reprimand and Probation (Stipulation and Final Order); (ii) this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public upon request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent upon and subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does not approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Lucas nor the Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) she has fully read this Stipulation and Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) she voluntarily, without any force or duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) she states that no promise or representation has been made to induce her to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) she has

consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully advised with regard to her rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with an attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below.

STIPULATION OF FACTS

- 1. The Commission has licensed Lucas since May 7, 1998. Lucas's Professional Teaching License, with an endorsement in Special Education: Generalist (PK-12), is valid from November 17, 2017, through February 12, 2023. During all relevant times, Lucas was employed by the Beaverton School District (BSD).
- 2. On February 3, 2016, the Commission received a district report alleging Lucas errantly and negligently, left materials containing confidential student special education information at a public restaurant. After Lucas left the building, restaurant staff located, reviewed, and then contacted the student's family to report the finding of the documents. The District determined this to be a violation of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and district policy and on January 27, 2016, issued Lucas a Letter of Reprimand for policy violations related to her conduct. Lucas did not intend for the materials to be viewed by anyone else; she inadvertently and mistakenly left them on the table where she had been sitting.
- 3. On March 15, 2017, the Commission received a district report alleging Lucas had violated professional standards and local policy related to classroom management and improper student restraints. Commission investigation determined that Lucas, on one occasion, failed to follow approved Oregon Intervention System (OIS) training and district policy on student intervention, physical force, restraints, reporting and debriefing, by failing to file the proper report and debrief after she used protective physical intervention to push away a student, who was known to inappropriately touch students and staff members private areas, and had lunged for Lucas' genital area. On March 6, 2017, the district issued Lucas a letter of reprimand with a five day suspension without pay related to her conduct.
