A discrepancy on the character question portion of Braich's application was referred to Professional Practices for investigation. The resulting investigation determined that Braich failed to report a 2008 DUII conviction as required.

After review of the matters alleged, Braich and the Commission agree that their respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to certain facts and the imposition of a Public Reprimand and four year Probation.

This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the sanction to be imposed. Braich stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in the Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law set forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Braich waives the right to a hearing to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below.
