- 2 2. In June 2017, school officials received a report that during the 2015-2016 school
- 3 year, Ten Eyck had engaged in a sexual relationship with a then 17 year old student
- 4 (█) who had attended Ten Eyck's advisory class at Lincoln High School.
- 5 Information was shared with local law enforcement who conducted an investigation.
- 6 Additional information was obtained alleging that Ten Eyck was flirtatious with
- 7 other female students in his class, inappropriately communicated with female
- 8 students via social media / Facebook messenger, and engaged in conversations that
- 9 were overly friendly and inappropriate for a student / teacher relationship. District
- 10 officials started to conduct a local investigation; however, before they could complete
- 11 the investigation, Ten Eyck resigned his employment effective July 12, 2017.

- 13 3. Commission Investigators notified Ten Eyck by certified mail December 15, 2017,
- 14 and again by email on January 5, 2018, of their official request to interview Ten Eyck
- 15 regarding these allegations. Ten Eyck failed to respond as directed. On July 14, 2017,
- 16 Ten Eyck emailed the "contact" email for the Commission and asked how he could
- 17 rescind or surrender his teaching license. Follow up emails by the investigator went
- 18 unanswered.

20 CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

21 George L. Ten Eyck engaged in unprofessional conduct as described above. Ten

22 Eyck's conduct constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR

24 *judgment*), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (*Using district lawful and reasonable rules and*

25 *regulations*), OAR 584-020-0030(2)(b) (*Skill in communicating with administrators,*

26 *students, staff, parents, and other patrons*); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(f) (*Any sexual*

27 *conduct with a student*) as defined by OAR 584-020-0005(5); OAR 584-020-

28 0040(4)(o) as it incorporates, OAR 584-020-0035(1)(c)(A) (*Not demonstrating or*

29 *expressing professionally inappropriate interest in a student's personal life*), OAR 584-

30 020-0035(1)(c)(B) (*Not accepting or giving or exchanging romantic or overly personal*

31 *gifts or notes with a student*); and OAR 584-020-0035(1)(c)(D) (*Honoring appropriate*


1 *adult boundaries with students in conduct and conversations at all times). The*
2 *conduct alleged in section three above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of*
3 *ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(p)(Subject to the exercise of any legal right*
4 *or privilege, failure or refusal by an educator under investigation to respond to*
5 *requests for information, to furnish documents or to participate in interviews with a*
6 *Commission representative relating to a Commission investigation).*

8 The Commission’s authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon
9 ORS 342.175.

10 **FINAL ORDER**

11 The Commission hereby revokes George L. Ten Eyck’s Educator license.
12 IT IS SO ORDERED THIS 9th day of August, 2018.
