12	resignation. The district did not include a copy of Mr. Wallin's contract and the school board's		
13	resolution to suspend his license as required under OAR 584-050-0020. Subsequently, the		
14	district submitted the resolution and contract on December 21, 2001, and the Commission		
15	notified Mr. Wallin of intent to suspend his teaching license, and his opportunity for hearing by		
16	letter dated January 28, 2002. The letter was sent by Certified Mail—Return Receipt Requested		
17	#7001 0320 0005 0740 9497. The receipt was signed by Randall W. Wallin on February 2,		
18	2002, and returned to TSPC on February 5, 2002.

21	foregoing, the Commission finds Mr. Wallin to be in default and enters the following findings of

CONCLUSION OF LAW Mr. Wallin violated ORS 342.553 by failing to provide 60 days' notice prior to resignation from his teaching position. **ORDER** The Commission suspends the Oregon Standard Teaching License of Randall Wayne Wallin through June 12, 2002.
