3 4 5 6 7	In the Matter of the Control of the Educator License of ADAM REESE STIPULATION OF FACTS AND FINAL ORDER OF PUBLIC REPRIMAND AND PROBATION
7	On November 10, 2016, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission
8	(Commission) received a report from the Hillsboro School District (HSD) indicating
9	possible professional misconduct on the part of licensed educator, Adam Reese (Reese).
10	After review of the matters alleged, Reese and the Commission agree that their
11	respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to
12	certain facts, the imposition of a Public Reprimand, and a period of probation.
13	This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the
14	sanction to be imposed. Reese stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in the
15	Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law set
16	forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Reese waives the right to a hearing to
17	contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below.
18	By signing below, Reese acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to the
19	following: (i) he has been fully advised of his rights to notice and a hearing to contest the
20	findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally
21	waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of
22	Facts and Final Order of Public Reprimand and Probation (Stipulation and Final Order);
23	(ii) this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public
24	upon request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent
25	upon and subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does
26	not approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Reese nor the
27	Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) he has fully read this Stipulation and
28	Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) he voluntarily, without any force or
29	duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of
30	the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) he states that no promise or representation has
31	been made to induce him to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) he has
32	consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully
33	advised with regard to his rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with an
34	attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of
35	the Stipulated Final Order below.

STIPULATION OF FACTS

- The Commission has licensed Reese since May 7, 1998. Reese holds a
 Professional Teaching License, with endorsements in Physical Education (PK-12)
 and Social Studies (Pk-12), valid from April 26, 2017 through May 6, 2022.
 During all relevant times, Reese was employed by the Hillsboro School District
 (HSD).
- 2. On November 10, 2016, the Commission received a report from the HSD indicating Reese may have committed an act of gross neglect of duty and/or gross unfitness. Specifically, in violation of HSD policy, Reese had inappropriate verbal interactions with student athletes during football games/practices in the course of Reese's service as a head football coach at Hillsboro High School.
- 3. Investigation determined that on or about October 26, 2016, HSD administrators became aware of an incident that occurred on October 13, 2016, during halftime of a varsity football game held in Milwaukie. A student alleged that Reese had physically grabbed another student athlete (in full football padding/gear), and pushed him while yelling at him. An investigation was conducted and while the physical allegations were not fully substantiated and the HSD did not impose discipline for that, it was determined that Reese occasionally used profanity in front of students and other coaches while coaching football. The investigation determined that Reese's use of profanity did not appear directed at any individual student(s), but at the team as a whole. It also determined that Reese's use of profanity appeared limited to his coaching duties and found no evidence such conduct occurred in the classroom. HSD determined Reese's conduct violated district policy, issuing Reese a written reprimand dated November 22, 2016, revised on June 7, 2017.
- 4. In the time following Reese's reported conduct, Reese has, on his own accord, taken multiple training courses and opportunities to improve his coaching abilities and interactions, including training related to coach / student interactions, leadership, parent relationships, modeling behavior and other related studies. Since the 2016 incident, there have been no other known reports of any related misconduct on the part of Reese.

10	CONCLUSION OF LAW
11	The conduct described above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS
12	342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(1)
13	(Recognize the worth and dignity of all persons and respect for each individual), OAR
14	584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), and OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using
15	district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations).
16	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon
17	ORS 342.175.
18	ORDER
19	The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and
20	conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a Public Reprimand on Adam Reese's
21	Oregon educator license.
22	Furthermore, the Commission imposes a period of one (1) year of probation upon
23	Reese's licensure to commence from the date this order is signed by the Commission and
24	subject to the following conditions:

26	1. Reese shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical Performance of
27	Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 584, Division
28	020.
