8		On March 29, 2018, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (Commission) issued a
9	Notice	e of Opportunity for Hearing to Kristin Anne McKenzie (McKenzie) in which the Commission
10	charge	ed her with Gross Neglect of Duty. The Notice was sent via U.S. First Class Mail and U.S.
11	Certifi	ed Mail Receipt 7017 0190 0000 6246 9051 to the address on file with the Commission. The
12	Notice	e designated the Commission file as the record for purposes of proving a prima facie case. The
13	Certifi	ed Mail receipt was returned signed to the Commission on April 2, 2018. The regular, first
14	class n	nail was not returned to the Commission, and is assumed to have been delivered. The Notice of
15	Oppor	tunity for Hearing, dated March 29, 2018, and signed by Anthony Rosilez, Executive Director,
16	stated	:

IF YOU DO NOT REQUEST A HEARING OR IF YOU FAIL TO APPEAR AT A HEARING, THE COMMISSION WILL ADOPT AN ORDER OF DEFAULT WHICH MAY INCLUDE THE REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION OF YOUR LICENSE OR OTHER DISCIPLINE."
24		nzie did not request a hearing. The Commission, therefore, finds McKenzie to be in default and
25		the following findings of fact, conclusions of law, and final order, based on the files and
26	record	s of the Commission concerning this matter.
27		
28		FINDINGS OF FACT
29	1.	Kristin Anne McKenzie has been licensed by the Commission since May 15, 2015. McKenzie
30		holds a Preliminary Teaching License, with endorsements in English Language Arts (PK-12)
31		and Social Studies (PK-12), valid from May 16, 2016, through October 14, 2018. During all
32		relevant times, McKenzie was employed by the Beaverton School District.
33	2.	On May 16, 2017, the Commission received information from the Beaverton School district
34		indicating McKenzie may have committed acts which constitute gross neglect of duty. The
35		district reported McKenzie had reported to work under the influence of alcohol on school
36		grounds on or about May 10, 2017.
37		Investigation determined that on May 10, 2017, school officials were notified by staff that
38		McKenzie appeared intoxicated in the classroom. Co-workers described McKenzie as,
39		slurring her words, crying when it was out of context to do so, smelling of an alcoholic

1	beverage, and unsteady on her feet. At approximately 1:00 PM McKenzie was contacted by		
2	the building principal who observed McKenzie to smell of alcohol, have red eyes and slurred		
3	speech. McKenzie was confronted about the allegation and agreed to take a breath test.		
4	McKenzie submitted two breath samples at a local occupational health facility, one at 2:48		
5	PM with a test result of .102 BAC and the second test at 3:06 PM with a test results of .094		
6	BAC. Both test results indicated McKenzie was under the influence of alcohol and over the		
7	presumptive legal limit by Oregon law as related to driving under the influence (.08 BAC).		
8	McKenzie's start time for work was 10:30 AM.		
9	3. On May 16, 2017, McKenzie submitted her resignation to the Beaverton School District.		
10	CONCLUSIONS OF LAW		
11	McKenzie's conduct described above, constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS		
12	342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professiona		
13	judgment), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations);		
14	and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(g) (Appearing on duty or at any district-sponsored activity while		
15	under the influence of alcohol or any controlled substance).		
16			
17	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon ORS 342.175.		
18			
19	FINAL ORDER		
20			
21	The Commission hereby suspends Kristin Anne McKenzie's Oregon educator license for a		
22	period of sixty (60) days, to begin upon the date this order is signed and in effect.		
23			
24	In addition, the Commission places McKenzie on probation for a period of two (2) years to		
25	commence upon reinstatement of McKenzie's Oregon educator license. This probation period is		
26	subject to the following terms and conditions:		
27			
28	1. McKenzie shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical Performance		
29	of Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 584, Division 020.		
30			
31	Violation of any term or condition of probation shall constitute an independent basis for the		
32	Commission to revoke McKenzie's Oregon educator license or otherwise impose discipline, after first		
33	providing McKenzie with notice and opportunity for hearing.
