Who We Are:



- The **Youth Development Division** is an agency located within the Oregon Department of Education.
 - Youth Development Grantmaking
 - Juvenile Crime Prevention (JCP) and Compliance Monitoring
 - Oregon Youth Reengagement System
- The Division's governing body is the Youth Development Council
 - Governor-appointed director
 - Expertise, experience and interest in youth development
 - Membership includes practitioners, advocates, Tribal Nations, local governments, juvenile justice system, and youth.
 - Provides strategic guidance, approves grantmaking processes and oversight of Juvenile Justice compliance work
- The Division and Council together are Youth Development Oregon

Youth Development Oregon aligns systems and invests in communities to ensure equitable and effective services for youth ages 6 through 24. Throughout Oregon and Tribal Nations, we support educational and career success, disrupt youth crime and violence, and affirm youth strengths and safety.

Increase in # of Opportunity Youth In 2021, <u>1 in 8</u> youth ages 16-24 (13.6%) in Oregon was disconnected from school and work (62,211 youth).

This represents an additional 9,307 disconnected youth (or a 17.5% increase in the number of Opportunity Youth since 2019.)

YDD Workforce and Reengagement programs are designed to serve Opportunity Youth and reconnect them to education and employment.







Outreach




Necessary elements for successful outreach:

- Access to youth (location, time)
- Trust building
- Organizational partnerships (schools, nonprofits, agencies)
- Data sharing
- Barrier removal and incentives for participation
- Streamlined referrals/access
- Relationships, relationships, relationships



Multnomah Education Service District Community Outreach Events

- Multiple nonprofits and community-based organizations partnering at tabling events
- Games, prizes, music
- Distribution of resources
- Access to services and educational options



Outreach Services:

Identification, contact, and retention of youth who are disengaged or at risk of disengagement.

Supportive Services



Necessary elements for Supportive Services include:

- Responsive, understanding, and caring systems of support
- Systems designed around the wellbeing and overall health of the individual
- Tailored access and support for basic needs assistance
- Access to multi-tiered levels of support (such as health services, childcare, and/or legal services)
- Inclusionary practices and services
- Relationships, relationships, relationships





Educational Services at the Heart




Educational Options

- Public high schools (Traditional K-12)
- School & community-based GED
- Alternative high schools (public/ private)
- Charter schools
- Small learning environments (public/ private)
- Residential facilities
- Shelters and other community-based centers
- Other specialized programs
- Oregon's community college adult education departments

Youth Identified Options:

- Running Start/Early College programming
- School based GED options in traditional educational setting
- Specifically designed coursework related to GED supports
- Paid internships directly connected with credit-bearing or GED programming
- Get youth (student) feedback to design educational options.



Educational Services:

Specialized education, training, and/or support services that are structured and lead to high school graduation and GED completion

- Hands-on career exposure
- Real world application
- Barrier removal (transportation, childcare, etc.)




Model

- Creating a connective network of existing supports that break down the disconnect, silos, etc. that happen as of those systems; includes youth voice.
